Regular Meeting - Soldotna, Alaska

#### CALL TO ORDER

A Regular Meeting of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly was held on December 6, 2011, in the Borough Assembly Chambers, Soldotna, Alaska. President Knopp called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND INVOCATION

#### III. Ongoing Program Projects and Monthly Accomplishments

#### **Hazard Tree Removal**

- Contracts continue to be developed and bids solicited for expending funds accepted and appropriated by KPB from the 2009 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act ("ARRA"). These funds are dedicated to the creation of jobs by implementing hazardous fuel mitigation and FireWise education projects on the Kenai Peninsula. It is anticipated that all ARRA funds will be expended by January 2012.
- Current ongoing hazard tree removal projects include the 127 acre Cohoe Loop Fuel Reduction (Thin & Pile) Project and the 73 acre Kenai Redoubt Fuel Reduction (Thin & Pile) Project. These Thin and Pile projects began harvesting beetle-kill in November with public firewood distribution beginning in late December 12, 2011.
- SBB staff administered the KPB Stariski South "Over the Counter" Timber Sale for 900 acres of beetle-kill in Happy Valley. Project work on this timber sale is expected to begin winter 2012. SBB staff administered Land Use Permits in Anchor Point and Hope for the removal of "45 acres of beetle-kill from the remains of the KPB Rascal and Dusty Timber Sales and 7 acres of beetle-kill of KPB parcel and Mile 9 Hope Highway. SBB staff assisted in developing a Land Use Permit for 57 acres of KPB managed land on Tustumena Road in Kasllof for the removal of beetle-kill with project work to begin December 2011. SBB staff entered into negotiations in November with contractors for the 80 acre Belnap timber Sale, the 240 acre Four Mile timber Sale, and the 140 acre Stariski South Timber Sale due to skyrocketing public demand for firewood.

#### Reforestation

• All reforestation activities have ceased for the calendar year.

#### Technical Assistance

- SBB staff assisted the US Forest Service Forest Health Protection Program in creating a systematic
  inventory of economic and societal costs/losses on the Kenai Peninsula resulting from the spruce bark
  beetle outbreak of the past twenty years. This effort is part of a national US Forest Service project to
  documents the costs/effects of forest mortality throughout the western US from bark beetles and
  associated pathogens.
- SBB staff completed the five-year update of the All Hands All Lands Action Plan with a final version of the update expected to be reviewed/adopted by all cooperating agencies by mid December 2011.
- SBB staff participated in a statewide multi-agency workshop in Fairbanks that was sponsored by USDA & USDOI. The purpose of the" LANDFIRE" review for Alaska was to Improve mapping information and calibrate vegetation/forest fuels characteristics. SBB participation was pivotal in detailing the bark beetle impacts on the Kenal Peninsula and the importance this has in forest fire frequency and severity.

#### **Land/Vegetation Mapping**

 GIS staff has begun collaboration with the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge GIS, Fire Management and Ecologist staff toward the update of vegetation and fuels Information for the Kenai Peninsula.

#### Seasonal Fire Personnel

A 2011/12 Cooperative Agreement with ADOF for the use of the ADOF Forestry/Technicians and Division
of Forestry equipment continued in November. During November ADOF technicians completed the hand
felling portions on the Bridge Creek Watershed Fuel Reduction Project and the Clam Gulch State Park Fuel
Reduction Project, treated hazard trees adjacent to the Tsalteshi trails, and K-Beach Highway, and assisted
CES to remove fallen hazard trees during the extreme November wind storm. ADOF technicians will not
be performing any project work during December 2011.

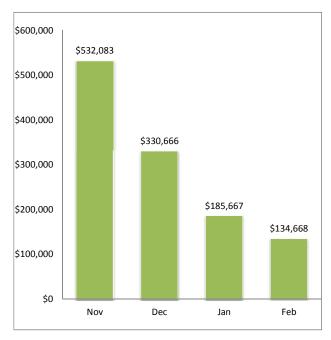

- 6. Total Drug Cost: All prescriptions totaled together at their card discount prices.
- 7. Average Drug Cost: Average Drug Cost per Rx at the card discounted price.
- 8. Retail Submitted Price: What the price would have been if the prescriptions weren't filled with the card.
- 9. Average Retail Submitted Price: Average Per Prescription price if the card wasn't presented at a discount.
- 10. Price Savings: Total dollar savings for all Rxs filled with the card.
- 11. Average Price Savings: Average price savings per prescription.
- 12. % Price Savings: Percentage price savings per prescription.
- 13. Total Utilizers: This is the total amount of people who represent the total amount of prescriptions *i.e.* some people fill multiple prescriptions. This gives you an indication of how many residents you are helping.

Upon further review of this ordinance it is my view that the ordinance should be modified to better clarify the authority the borough is exercising when having these projects performed and that the projects in fact will be consistent with that authority. Accordingly, I recommend that the assembly amend this ordinance as follows:

> Amend the third whereas clause as follows:

whereas, the borough receives revenues from the State of Alaska's fish tax, such revenues averaging approximately \$729,162 per year, depending upon the success of the commercial fishing industry for each year, which may be used to help reduce the effect of fisheries business activities on the borough including the expense of any municipal service per AS 29.60.450; and

Insert two new whereas clauses after the fourth existing whereas clause as follows:

WHEREAS, Alaska statute 29.35.010(8) authorizes the borough to acquire, manage, control use, and dispose of property which includes borough rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, installing culverts in borough rights-of-way is an exercise of this power; and

> Amend section one as follows:

SECTION 1. That \$100,000 is appropriated from the general fund fund balance to account no. 100.94910.12KWF.43011, to fund a grant agreement with the Kenai Watershed Forum to support culvert restoration projects at anadromous stream crossings within borough rights-of-way in areas of the borough outside of city limits.

The borough funded two grant awards in the amount of \$100,000 each to KWF through O2007-19-39 and O2009-19 to complete culvert restoration projects. KWF leveraged the borough funds as non-federal match for several grant programs, garnering additional funds for culvert removal and replacements that benefited the Donald E. Gilman River Center, the Seward-Bear Creek Flood Service Area and the Kenai Peninsula Borough Road Service Area. The assembly will be provided with a list of projects completed or near completion using the first \$200,000.

Upon enactment this ordinance will award KWF \$100,000 to complete culverts that impede fish passage. Following are the areas proposed for these projects at this time:

- 1) Paradise Lane (Nikiski)
- 2) Vandevere Road (Nikiski)
- 3) Messer Street (Soldotna)
- 4) Stickleback Lane (check dam Nikiski)
- 5) Moose River Drive (2 culverts Sterling)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> R2009-101 authorized the O2009-19 appropriation to award the second allocation in the amount of \$100,000.

KWF worked with Alaska Fish & Game, the river center department and the roads department staff to develop the above-listed projects. Completion of these projects is subject to the availability of funds and costs incurred. Should the assembly choose to authorize these additional funds, KWF has identified a potential matching grant source through the State of Alaska Department of Natural Resources. Matching funds are required and the local funding will make the proposed application very competitive.

John Czarneski, Resource Planner, will provide project oversight and Brenda Ahlberg, Community & Fiscal Projects Manager, shall provide grant management working in conjunction with Kenai Watershed Forum.

As determined by resolution 2011-043, the borough assembly recognized 27 unincorporated communities eligible to participate in the FY12 Community Revenue Sharing Program, hereinafter referred to as "program." Ordinance 2011-19-06 accepted and appropriated the funds in the amount of \$545,400, which will be equally disbursed to each unincorporated community.

This year the Alaska State Legislature approved an additional "one-time proportional" payment for municipalities and unincorporated communities. On November 17, 2011, the borough received notification that funds in the amount of \$181,791 were available for distribution. Each unincorporated community shall receive \$6,733 in addition to the original allocation of \$19,604.

From September through November community meetings were held to discuss the program, at which time residents were informed that the additional funds were anticipated. Residents voted on the use of funds and the entities to receive the allocations. The provided chart is a representation of the residents' input and the projects that are to be completed in the 27 unincorporated communities. The additional funds will be awarded through an amendment to individual grant agreements that have been executed between the borough and nonprofit or tribal entities (see resolution 2011-106). The Community & Fiscal Projects Manager shall oversee the program.

Lastly, at the time of this draft, Nanwalek, Razdolna and Voznesenka have not provided a FY12 application.

The water for the new Nikiski Fire Station #2 is provided by Nikishka Bay Utilities. The water has a low pH (acidic) level and is considered corrosive. Due to its low pH level, it will have a negative long term impact on the piping, equipment and appliances at Fire Station #2.

Installation of a chemical injection system will mitigate the corrosive nature of the water. The proposed system will inject sodium hydroxide NA OH (Caustic Soda) to neutralize the acidic pH of the water. This system has been used in similar conditions with success. The cost of the chemical injection system is estimated to be between \$25,000 and \$30,000.

At its November 9, 2011, board meeting, the Nikiski Fire Service Area Board approved the use of \$30,000 from the Nikiski Fire Service area Capital Project Fund, fund balance for the purchase and installation of a chemical injection system.

The Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) assessing department is required by state statute to value all properties at full and true value each year. While an annual valuation is required, an independent fee appraisal is not. As I understand, an agreed upon methodology was used as a means of determining the statutorily required annual "full and true value" for tax years 2006-2010. The methodology was then applied to the value determined for the 2005 tax year and provided for annual adjustments to the valuation for tax purposes. The KPB made the decision to get an independent appraisal for tax year 2011 to update the valuation of the Tesoro property, since the last independent appraisal was done in 2005.

No funds were budgeted in the FY2012 budget in anticipation of reaching another agreement on methodology, once a final value was determined for tax year 2011, negating the need for annual appraisals and saving both Tesoro and the KPB the time and expense of annual appraisals and the appeal process.

Ordinance 2011-19-59 was introduced in case KPB decides to seek an independent appraisal, for the 2012 tax year, for the Tesoro property. The decision on whether to hire an independent appraiser has not been made but must be made early in 2012 to meet the statutory timelines for determining values and allowing for taxpayer appeals. An appraiser cannot be hired if funds are not available. This ordinance allows the KPB the flexibility and funding necessary to make a timely decision in the best interest of the KPB. If the KPB does not hire an independent appraiser, these funds will not be spent.

Assembly member Charlie Pierce requested additional information on Ordinance 2011-19-63 during the finance committee meeting that occurred on December 6, 2011. Unfortunately, I was not able to attend that committee meeting as I was attending a conference with the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management in Anchorage on that date.

• Question #1: Is the borough using public facilities during times of emergency response?

Yes. The primary shelter locations are the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District schools. Alternate facilities, such as churches, have been identified and are also available for sheltering purposes.

The proposed equipment is a portable, modular system that can be transported to remote locations, used as a supplemental health care facility, or is available if primary shelters or medical facilities are damaged.

• Question #2: Why is there a need to purchase a second system?

The systems are modular and can be interconnected to expand the available space. The plan is to have one portable shelter facility in Seward, one in the Kenai/Soldotna area and one in Homer. If a seismic event damages bridges, each community would have a portable shelter system. If needed and if the roads are intact, the adjoining units can be transported down to enlarge the facility. The portable systems can also be transported by aircraft or ocean vessel.

The third portable shelter system will be requested under the 2012 State Homeland Security Grant program to complete the project. Materials and supplies purchased for the first unit have already been used for two real-world sheltering events that occurred during the month of November 2011.

The Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) identified the lack of a regional, integrated plan to respond to a mass casualty and the lack of a coordinated plan to identify alternative care facilities in the event of a mass casualty incident or damage to regional hospitals. A subcommittee was appointed to address these issues and a grant application was made to support this effort. In 2010 the borough accepted a grant in the amount of \$326,617 from Alaska Division of Homeland Security & Emergency Management (DHS&EM), supporting the development of the mass casualty, alternative care facility plan and the first purchase of trailers, equipment and supplies specific to mass casualty incident response, interoperable communications and emergency sheltering (O2010-19-25).

The borough has received an award notification in the amount of \$270,850 from DHS&EM including funds of \$265,850 to purchase the second set of trailers, equipment, and supplies for mass casualty response and emergency sheltering; equipment to enhance disaster management and to implement training exercises in conjunction with local Citizen Emergency Response Teams.

In additional to the monetary award of \$265,850, the state allocated \$5,000 to the borough which will be used by DHS&EM to conduct a security vulnerability assessment of borough-owned infrastructure. The assessment will provide the borough essential support documentation for future funding requests to DHS&EM. This service shall be completed upon execution of a memorandum of understanding between DHS&EM and the borough. The borough will not receive direct funds but will receive the service, which is valued at \$5,000.

Eric Mohrmann, Emergency Management Director shall be the project manager for the grant funds. The performance period ends December 31, 2013.

The City of Seward (City) has developed plans for an office warehouse, electrical extension and realignment of drainage to support its public utility services. The project design would be facilitated by redrawing common property boundaries of City and Borough owned property.

This land exchange proposal as brought to them by the City of Seward. The ordinance would authorize the exchange of lands on an equal area/equal value basis. They are working on developing some facilities around their backup electrical generation facility which is adjacent to the Seward School campus. To best configure their project, they proposed this land exchange basically readjusting the lot lines to create an equal area exchange of about ½ acre on each side of the lines. Each parcel is approximately 0.56 acres. The exchanged lands would be useful to the Kenai Peninsula Borough for school campus purposes. The City's project includes trail and sidewalk improvements which would benefit the school campus. In this project, there is a trail that serves the Seward Elementary school which will be rerouted by this project.

The land that the Borough receives from this land exchange is adjacent to more Borough land. They end up with a configuration that is equal or better for the Borough and a configuration that is right on target for the City of Seward's project. The school district has been in on the loop on this and has expressed no objection to the land exchange.

Your consideration of this ordinance is greatly appreciated.

#### **END OF MEMORANDUM & STAFF REPORT**

Pro Tem Chairman Parker opened the meeting for public comment. Seeing and hearing no one wishing to speak, Pro Tem Chairman Parker closed the public comment period and opened discussion among the Commission.

This letter is a land exchange proposal for the Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) to consider exchanging land with the City of Seward (COS) bordering Seward's Fort Raymond electric substation.

The land exchange would involve portion of KPB tax parcel ID # 14502620 and # 14502621. Four maps have been included for reference. The Autocad drawing shows the pieces of land initially proposed in the swap. The wide green line indicates the initially proposed sections; the borough would acquire the portion shown as 23,953 sqft and the City would acquire the section indicating 24,193 sqft.

This land Exchange would benefit both KPB and COS. The benefits to KPB include additional land options close to all the major schools in the Seward area and COS' willingness to construct additional sidewalk on Sea Lion Avenue to accommodate the foot traffic between the elementary school and the high school.

With the expected reroute of the bike path within city boundaries, the additional sidewalk will increase the safety of students, bikers and pedestrians, while creating a more direct route for the elementary students walking to the high school.

- 2) COS purchase the land from KPB based on a fair market value appraisal.

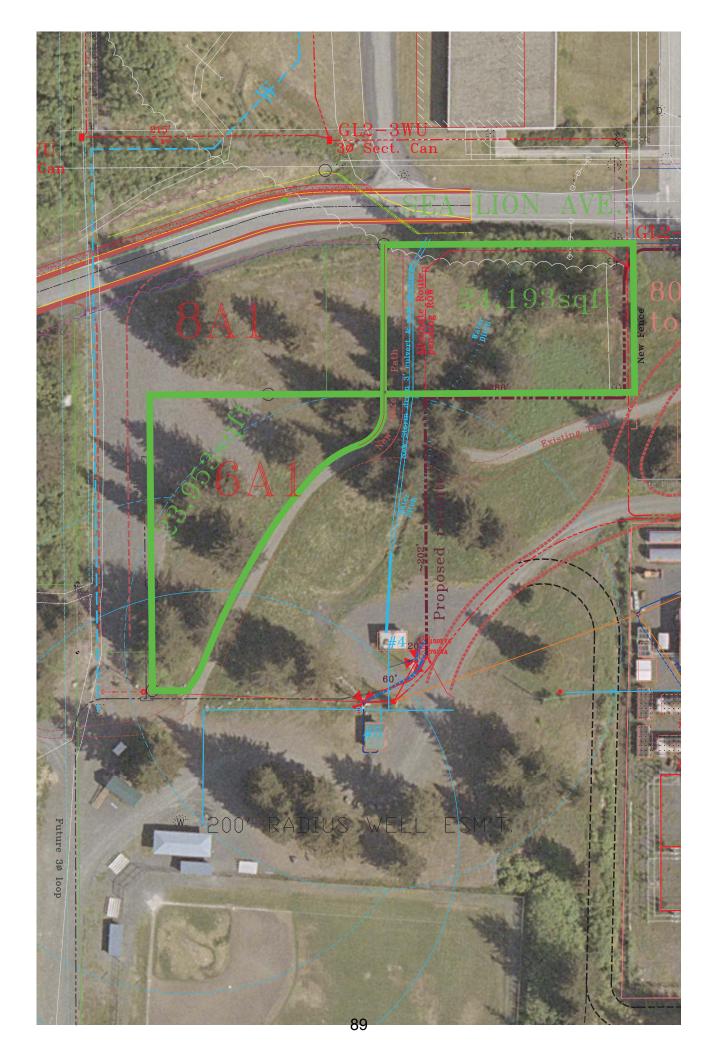

Prior to closing of the sale, in the event that KPB or CITY OF SEWARD fail to make any payment required, or fail to submit or execute any and all documents and papers necessary for closing and transfer of title within the time period specified in this agreement, the other party may terminate this agreement.

### 9. MUTUAL DEFENSE AND INDEMNIFICATION

Each party shall indemnify, defend, save and hold the other party, their elected and appointed officers, agents and employees, harmless from any and all claims, demands, suits, or liability of any nature, kind or character including costs, expenses, and attorneys fees resulting from their own performance or failure to perform in accord with the terms of this Agreement in any way whatsoever. This defense and indemnification responsibility includes claims alleging acts or omissions by the other party or their agents which are said to have contributed to the losses, failure, violations, or damage. However, neither party shall not be responsible for any damages or claim arising from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the other party, their agents, or employees.

### 10. HAZARDOUS MATERIAL

Both parties covenant and agree that no hazardous substances or wastes shall be located on or stored on either property prior to closing.

### 11. ASSIGNMENTS

This agreement may not be assigned.

### 12. MISCELLANEOUS

A. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement and the documents referred to herein contain the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. Both parties shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent, and take all reasonable actions to suppress destructive and uncontrolled grass, brush, and forest fires on the land under agreement, and comply with all laws, regulations and rules promulgated and enforced by the protection agency responsible for forest protection within the area wherein the demised premises are located.
- H. Notice. Any notice or demand, which under the terms of this agreement or under any statute must be given or made by the parties thereto, shall be in writing, and be given or made by registered or certified mail, addressed to the other party at the address shown on the contract. However, either party may designate in writing such other address to which such notice of demand shall thereafter be so given, made or mailed. A notice given hereunder shall be deemed received when deposited in a U.S. general or branch post office by the addressor.

- I. Responsibility of Location. It shall be the responsibility of each party to properly locate improvements on the subject parcels.
- J. Rights of Mortgagee or Lienholder. In the event of cancellation or forfeiture of a sale agreement for cause, the holder of a properly recorded mortgage, conditional assignment, or collateral assignment will have the option to acquire the agreement for the unexpired term thereof, subject to the same terms and conditions as in the original instrument
- K. <u>Sanitation</u>. Greens agree to comply with all regulations or ordinances which a proper public authority in its discretion shall promulgate for promotion of sanitation. Premises under purchase agreement shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and every effort shall be made to prevent any pollution of waters and lands.
- L. <u>Construction</u>. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been jointly drafted by both parties. It shall be constructed according to the fair intent of the language as a whole, not for or against any party. The interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Alaska. The titles of sections in this Agreement are not to be construed as limitations of definitions but are for identification purposes only.

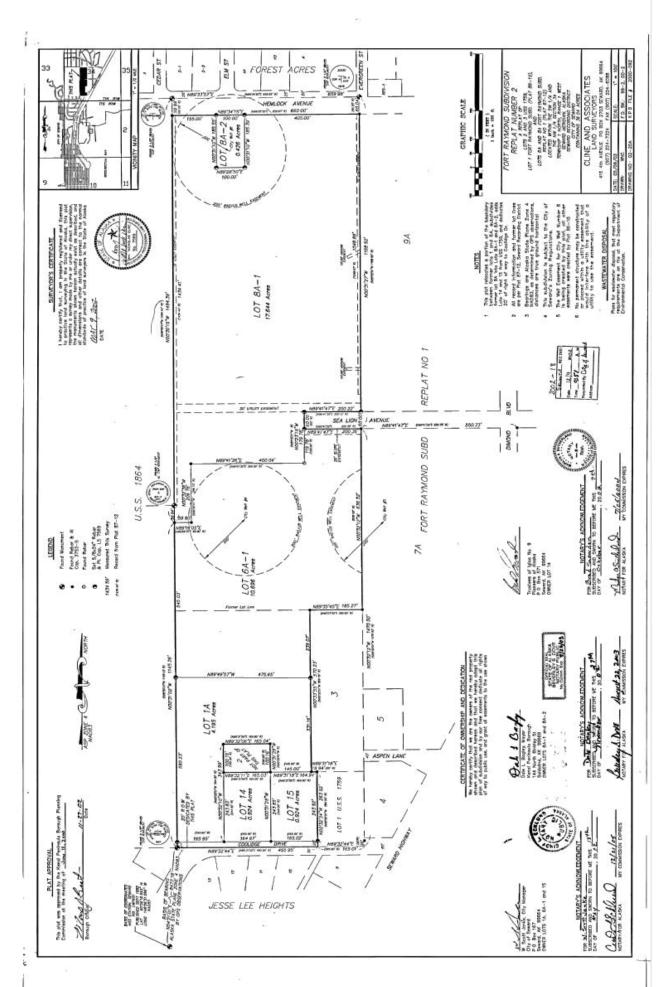

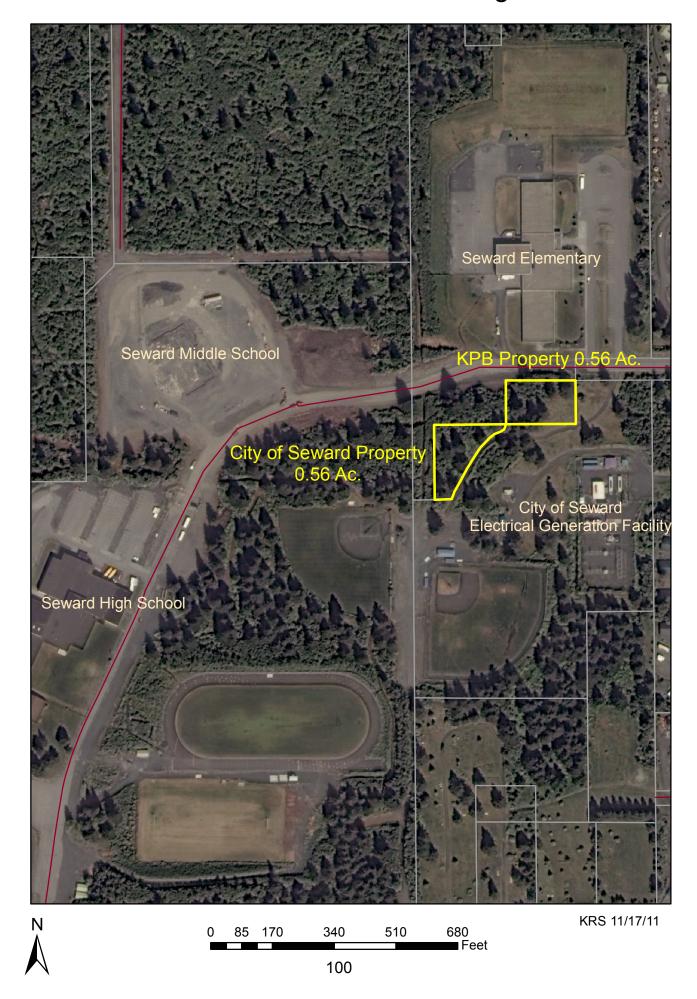

This ordinance would amend the code to provide that the assembly shall set the calendar for the full year ahead and allows it the flexibility to provide for one meeting for some of those months. It should also be clarified to enable the assembly to amend that calendar during the year should something arise requiring the preapproved calendar to be revised to either change a meeting date or delete a meeting.

The borough's new 911 Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system went live in September 2011. As part of the purchase agreement with New World System, the 911 software vendor, the borough entered into a software maintenance agreement which goes into effect January 1, 2012. The annual cost for this agreement is \$50,552, of which \$25,276 is for the period January 1. 2012 through June 30, 2012 (FY2012).

The 911 department did not budget for this expenditure and a supplemental appropriation is needed to provide the necessary funding in FY2012.

Shortened hearing is requested to adequately fund the agreement as soon as possible given that it is effective January 1, 2012.

care costs

The cost of health care has risen dramatically within the last 11 years such that at this point in time the borough spends in excess of \$18,660 per employee for health care as compared to \$6,055 in 2000. The school district currently spends approximately of \$17,436 per employee on an annual basis for health care and these expenses are anticipated to continue increasing. Additionally, this rising cost of health care is increasing the borough and school district's liability for PERS and TRS due to the health care coverage. In June 2011 the borough administration began holding meetings with representatives from the school district, Central Peninsula Hospital, South Peninsula Hospital, and the cities of Kenai, Homer, Soldotna and Seward to consider what options may be available to reduce healthcare costs. Independent expertise is now needed to assist the group in identifying potential mechanisms for reducing health care costs.

Additionally, as the owner of two hospitals the borough needs independent expertise to assist it in identifying the direction the health care industry is taking and steps the borough may take to protect its interests. Some of the funds appropriated in this ordinance would be used to hire outside experts to accomplish this goal.

Your consideration of this ordinance would be appreciated.

<u>Purpose as stated in petition</u>: The section line dissects property and goes nowhere. Access already exists with east-west section line from highway to the edge of bluff and adjacent properties. It is not used and part of the section line is over the side of the bluff and is unusable.

PC Meeting: 12/12/11

Petitioners: James H. and Muriel Mead of Alberton, Montana

Public notice appeared in the December 1 and December 8, 2011 issues of the Peninsula Clarion.

All surrounding property owners were notified by certified mailings as required by the code. Five (5) certified notices were mailed; one notice was hand delivered. No return receipts had been returned when the staff report was prepared.

Seventeen (17) regular mailings and were sent to agencies and interested parties. Six notices were sent to KPB Departments. Notices were mailed to the Clam Gulch Post Office and Kasilof Community Library to be posted in public locations. The notice and maps were posted on the Borough web site and bulletin board.

#### Statement of objection

No statements of objection were received.

#### Staff discussion

The Planning Commission granted a three-year conditional approval to the section line easement vacation on February 25, 2008. A condition of approval was to submit a plat within three years. The Assembly concurred with the Commission's approval on March 11, 2008.

### Statement of objection

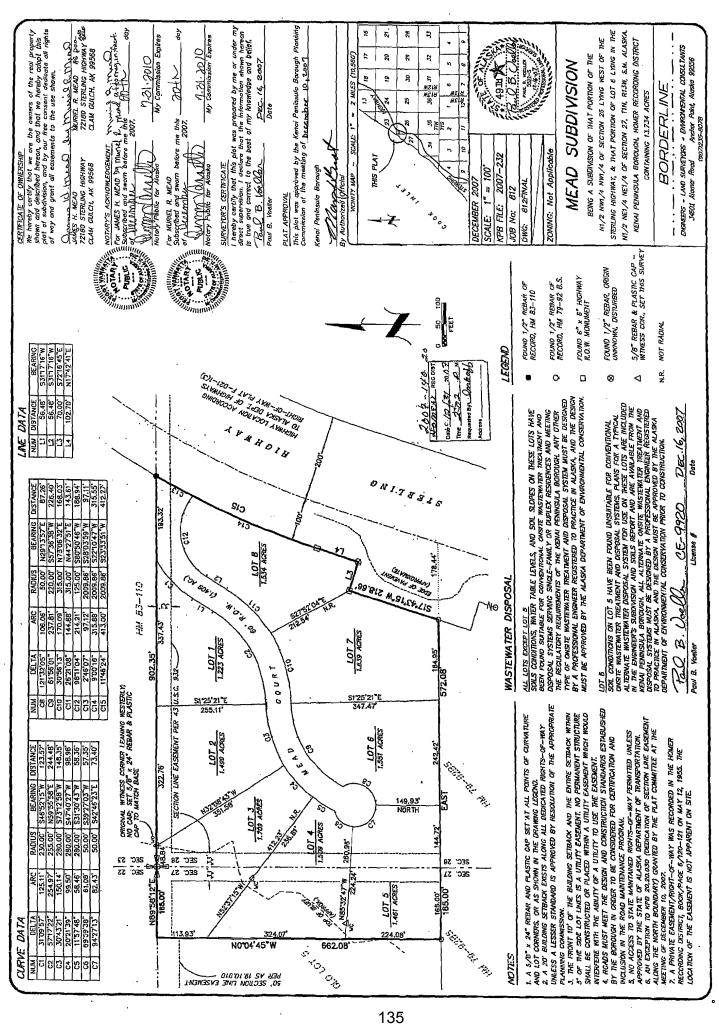

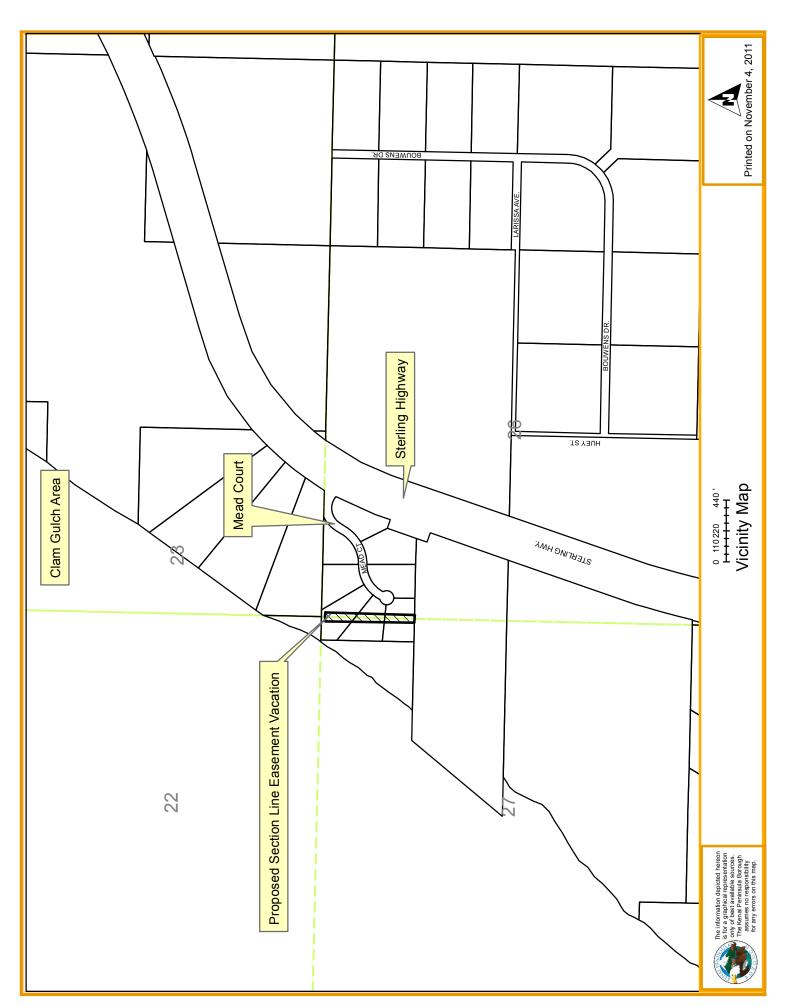
