The next meeting of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly was scheduled for June 19, 2012, at 7:00 p.m. in the Borough Assembly Chambers, Soldotna, Alaska.

ASSEMBLY COMMENTS

(10:56:08)

Assembly Member Haggert thanked Borough Attorney Colette Thompson for her work on the Resolution 2012-051 Sublease Agreement. He noted that KPB 21.18 and the changes being made needed to be approached slow and deliberately, and it would eventually be correct without destroying everything. He invited everyone to come enjoy "Trails Day in Kachemak Bay State Park" on June 9, 2012, where there would be inexpensive water taxi rides across the bay.

Assembly Member Johnson thanked everyone involved with negotiating the sublease agreement for Resolution 2012-051. He stated that KPB 21.18 was important and he looked forward to future debates on the issue. He wished everyone a safe and fabulous summer.

Assembly Member McClure noted her appreciation for the comments made by Mayor Navarre regarding anadromous streams, and stated there were definitely polarized views on the subject and a working group was needed to find the balance between protection and personal rights. She said this was her third budget process and it had been pleasant.

Assembly Member Tauriainen thanked Mayor Navarre and Finance Director Craig Chapman for bringing forward a budget that was easy to work with. He reiterated the statement made by Assembly Member Smith, "in three years the budget had only gone up three percent," this did not represent a runaway budget. He noted that KPB 21.18 was not on the agenda tonight but it was discussed, and he felt that it hadn't been approached slow and deliberate, and had he known all of the water bodies involved with it he would not have supported it.

Assembly Member Smith stated that habitat protection was important in order to make sure that future generations had plenty of salmon. He stated in regards to slow and deliberate, the amendment he had introduced to KPB 21.18 was introduced in June and then adopted in February, it was set so that the Planning Commission could have several discussions on the subject. He said information provided from the River Center showed that privately owned parcels affected by KPB 21.18 prior to the amendment was 2,797 and after the amendment it only increased by 871 privately owned parcels. He did not feel it was an overreach for the borough, all it did was extend protection to less than 900 parcels. He said when it came to constitutional issues, basically this was a land use ordinance, it controlled land use like zoning, to say that zoning or land use control by municipalities was unconstitutional was clearly not true, cities and boroughs in the state of Alaska that had zoning

or land use regulations and they were constitutional, an example would be the 20-foot set back from a right-of-way.

Assembly Member Murphy said that when you owned a piece of property there were always certain restrictions, and it was the responsibility of the Assembly to protect the resource which was a vital part of the economy and wanted her children and grandchildren to be able to enjoy the same resource. She said she had read the constitution and was not a constitutional lawyer and yes it may seem clear when read; however, if it were all that clear there would not be so many constitutional lawyers who fought over provisions in those documents. She noted that she and her husband owned a small business and the employees had received pay increases this year, the carpenters received about a ten percent increase and in addition they were given extra money to pay for gas. She said anyone who wanted to help with the Coastal Zone Management issue, the State would be holding a meeting on July 2, 2012 in the KPB Assembly Chambers.

Assembly Member Smalley thanked Mayor Navarre, Finance Director Craig Chapman and all staff involved for the work done on the budget and the presentations given, it was one of the most painless budget processes he had been through. He thanked Mayor Navarre for the comments made on KPB 21.18 and said slow and deliberate was a good position to take. He congratulated his wife Susan Smalley for 44 years of marriage. He noted his WIR NACo trip report was available in the Clerk's Office.

President Knopp said there were several things to be thankful for and noted Resolution 2012-051 being adopted and an easy budget cycle as two of them.

With no further business to come before the assembly, President Knopp adjourned the meeting at 11:18 p.m.

Emergency Service Area to the Lowell Point Volunteer Fire Department

The Lowell Point Emergency Service Area (LPESA) will be abolished effective July 1, 2012. Any remaining service area assets would normally revert to the Kenai Peninsula Borough except as may otherwise be required for any assets purchased with grant funds. The administration is working to determine a list of assets owned by the Service Area. It is anticipated that the list will be included in the ordinance prior to final hearing.

The Lowell Point Volunteer Fire Department, a volunteer fire department in Lowell Point, has requested that all remaining assets of the LPESA be transferred to it before July 1, 2012, to be used for fire and rescue purposes. Transferring the assets with the requirement that they be used for fire and rescue purposes would serve a public purpose. Upon abolishment of the service area the Kenai Peninsula Borough will no longer have the power to directly provide for fire and emergency medical services in that area.

The assets were obtained through grant funds and a service area mill rate levied upon real property owners within the former service area. Accordingly, it is appropriate to convey these assets to the volunteer fire department on the condition that the assets are used for a public purpose and that the assets are subject to all applicable borough grant requirements, including maintaining and operating a registered fire department, providing regular reports to the borough and meeting any audit requirements. It is anticipated the grant agreement would be for a three year term.

Your favorable consideration of this ordinance would be appreciated.

James M. Boyer has requested the assembly allow the assessor to accept his late-filed real property tax disabled veteran exemption application filed after March 31, 2012. KPB 5.12.105 and AS 29.45.030(f) allow for late-filed exemptions to be granted by the assembly. For an application filed after February 15 and before March 31 the applicant must file an affidavit stating good cause for failure to comply with the February 15 deadline. Good cause is defined by KPB 5.12.105(E)(4) as:

Good cause for failure to file by February 15, for purposes of this subsection, include but are not limited to extended travel out of state, medical conditions, health related conditions, family medical needs or emergencies, or other similar causes that reasonably prevented the applicant from timely filing. Absent extraordinary circumstances, a mere failure to pick up or read mail or to make arrangements for an appropriate and responsible person to pick up or read mail or a failure to timely provide a current address to the Department of Assessing will not be deemed good cause.

For applications filed after March 31 the applicant has the additional burden of showing an inability to comply based on a serious condition or extraordinary event beyond the taxpayers control. KPB 5.12.105(E)(5) provides:

If an otherwise qualified claimant is unable to comply with the March 31 deadline for filing an application, the assembly may, by ordinance, waive the claimant's failure to file the application by such date, and authorize the Assessor to accept the application as if timely filed. For purposes of this subsection, an

inability to comply must be caused by a serious condition or extraordinary event beyond the taxpayer's control. This section does not create any private rights whatsoever, nor does it in any manner require the mayor or any assembly member to introduce or approve any such ordinance.

Mr. Boyer states in his attached letter that he recently retired from the U.S. Coast Guard and underwent great trouble getting his disability determination from the Veteran's Administration. It was only after intervention from Congressman Don Young's office that he was able to obtain a final determination on March 28, 2012. Additionally he states that he was not in Alaska at the time of the official filing deadline. Finally, he notes that the borough's application form for this exemption states at the top that "applicants must provide documentation each year of 50% or more service connected disability to qualify." He understood this to mean that he had to have all the documentation before filing for this exemption.

Notwithstanding the requirements statement of the disabled veteran exemption form, it is Borough standard practice to accept exemption forms when further documentation is forthcoming but not yet available. A no or yes question on the form asks "Do you have a disability rated 50% or greater by the VA?" When documentation is forthcoming at a later date, this question cannot be answered in the affirmative. An option should be allowed for statements of forthcoming qualification. Until the form is clarified, this can lead to individuals not fully understanding their filing rights.

FAILURE TO MEET THE FILING DEADLINE IS BASED ON THE FOLLOWING GOOD CAUSE:

I officially retired from the U.S. Coast Guard on 01SEP2011. The VA allows you to submit your claim for compensation and pension (C&P) no more than 6 months before your retirement date. I submitted my claim to the Veterans Administration (VA) in March of 2011 for C&P via my local representative (the Anchorage American Legion), which the VA acknowledged receipt of on 25APR11 (see attachment 1). I then spent the next 10 months trying to get the VA to schedule my C&P medical exams. I called them and had my representative (Anchorage American Legion) contact them close to 50 times and submitted dozens of emails trying to get my exams scheduled. Finally, on 15 Dec 2011 I submitted a Congressional request to Congressman Don Young (see attachment 2) to ask for his involvement in getting my longstanding issue of getting my C&P exams scheduled. After substantial intervention by his staff the VA finally scheduled my C&P exams in mid-February and the last one was completed on 15 March 2011.

Yesterday, 02APR11 I received my final determination dated 28MAR12 from the VA (see attachment 1) stating that they determined my overall or combined rating of 60%. At this point I determined I was eligible to apply for the Disabled Veterans Exemption, but was outside of the official filing deadline. I submitted my package to the VA at the earliest time I was allowed and if they would have processed my claim within their advertised timeline of 5 months from the time an application is received I would have been able to meet the deadline. I did not know that I could have applied before getting my determination from the VA and assumed that I had to attach evidence to the application based on the wording at the top of the application which says "Applicants must provide documentation each year of 50% or more service connected disability to qualify." I did not have this evidence until I received my letter from the VA on 02APR11.

These delays were not caused by any actions on my part and were an extraordinary onetime event that was beyond my control. I ask for a waiver of the deadline and that I be granted the exemption for the 2012 tax year.

Alaska for the Homer High School Athletic Facilities Construction Project

The Homer High School track was constructed in 1985 and has not been resurfaced in 26 years. In 2008 Homer High school canceled the "Homer Invitational Meet" due to the lack of participants willing to compete on the degraded track. Since that time no competitive meets have been held at the facility. On October 13, 2011, the Homer High School track was closed at the recommendation of borough Risk Management Committee due to safety concerns. This project has been set as a priority so that access to the track can resume as soon as possible.

On April 3, 2012 the Assembly passed Ordinance 2011-19-78, providing funding for the Homer High School track design in anticipation of legislative funding for construction of the project. The funding for this project is included in Senate Bill 160, which has passed the legislature and is awaiting the Governor's signature.

In order to meet the goal of project completion this year and in consideration of the weather and temperatures necessary for track replacement, time is of the essence. To maintain a successful project schedule, the project will go to bid in mid May with a bid opening on June 21, 2012. The construction contract is scheduled for award, contingent on funding, on July 2, 2012. If weather conditions cooperate and the schedule is maintained, the track will be ready for use in mid to late September.

Passage of this ordinance is contingent on the Governor signing SB160 without vetoing the funding for project.

Kevin Lyon, Capital Projects Director, shall be the project manager for the grant funds. The performance period ends June 30, 2017.

This contract is for a one-year period in the total cost of \$91,562 to the borough. The USGS shall contribute an additional \$58,054 for a total project costs of \$149.616. Accompanying this resolution are the draft letter and projected annual costs. with future costs provided for planning purposes only. Sufficient funds were appropriated in the FY 2013 budget. Thank you for your interest in the continuation of hydrologic data collection for flood warning and flood forecasting on the Kenai Peninsula. We have enclosed a Joint Funding Agreement (JFA) to continue operation for the stage-only gaging station on Anchor River near Anchor Point, and the continuous record stream gaging stations on Grouse Creek near Seward, Snow River near Seward, Kenai River at Cooper Landing, and Kenai River below Skilak Lake Outlet near Sterling.

Beginning in Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2013 (October 1, 2012), and effective in years forward, Federal funding listed on Joint Funding Agreements (JFAs) reflects only monies directly associated with the Cooperative Water Program at the Water Science Center level. Other USGS services that are critical to the jointly funded work—such as those associated with facilities, quality assurance and quality control, technical training, and science support—are no longer reflected on the USGS side of the JFA. USGS continues to provide these support benefits and services, but under a new USGS business practice can no longer include these in the Cooperative Water Program appropriated funds line item on the JFA. Instead these important benefits services are supported in Water Science Centers through other Bureau common services accounting measures unrelated to the Cooperative Water Program.

This change in USGS business accounting does not change the overall gross costs of USGS work nor does it diminish the total benefits and services that are provided by the USGS to meet the high USGS standards of quality for Cooperative Water Program work in a timely fashion. In the tables below, funding is listed both under the new and old accounting practices, for comparison.

Annual costs to the Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) and U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) are summarized below:

- Operate and maintain the streamgage.

- Record stage data every 15 minutes.

- Post near real-time stage and discharge data on the USGS web site http://waterdata.usgs.gov/ak/nwis/.
- Store the data in the USGS databases.
- Publish the data in our annual Water-Resources Data for the United States report (http://wdr.water.usgs.gov/).

The Kenai Peninsula Borough will be billed quarterly, beginning September, 2012. The USGS DUNS number is 178930541. Work performed with funds from this agreement will be conducted on a fixed-cost basis. The USGS will retain all equipment purchased with funds from this agreement. It is understood that data obtained during the course of this work will be available to the USGS for publication and use in connection with related work. This agreement operates under the authority of statute 43 USC 50, which allows us to perform this work.

- 2. A service gratuity of up to 15% will be reimbursed when paid as part of the meal.
- 3. Reimbursement shall not be allowed for alcoholic beverages.
- 4. Reimbursement shall not be allowed for room service in excess of the standard per meal rate.
- 5. Receipts must accompany credit card charges.
- 6. The Borough Mayor and Assembly President, as applicable, ar the only persons authorized to approve any exceptions to this policy.

The Nikiski Fire Service Area (NFSA) submitted a request for legislative grant funding in the Fiscal Year 2012/2013 State of Alaska Capital Budget. Senate Bill 160, which appropriated funding in the amount of \$975,000 for the purchase of an aerial fire apparatus was passed by the State Legislature and signed by Governor Parnell on May 14, 2012.

This grant is for the replacement of the department's 30 year old ladder truck that is in poor condition. This apparatus is used to provide fire protection to the industrial, commercial, and residential occupancies throughout the service area and has accumulated more than 2,400 hours on the engine. The typical lifespan for this type of apparatus is between 20 and 25 years. Major engine, pump, and hydraulic problems have kept the apparatus out-of-service and downtime is exceeding in-service availability. Parts needed for repair are obsolete. The ladder truck failure severely hampers the department's emergency response capabilities and can have a negative effect on the insurance rating for the community. The ladder truck is necessary to support the required fire flow of water and foam at the LNG plant and the oil refinery located within the industrial complex of Nikiski.

The service area board will consider a motion recommending acceptance of the grant at its regular board meeting to be held June 13, 2012. The Alaska Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development will provide the grant award with a five-year, project performance period ending June 30, 2017. James Baisden, NFSA Chief, shall provide grant oversight and project completion.

The Central Emergency Service Area (CES) submitted a request for legislative grant funding in the Fiscal Year 2012/2013 State of Alaska Capital Budget. Senate Bill 160 which appropriated funding in the amount of \$100,750 for the purchase of a rescue boat was passed by the State Legislature and signed by Governor Parnell on May 14, 2012.

CES personnel are trained in swift water rescue and boat handling on rivers and open water. CES also has its own certified dive team for rescue and recovery operations. CES responds to mutual aid requests for Ninilchik, Nikiski, Kenai and Cooper Landing for water-related incidents. CES is called upon numerous times per year to perform rescues from overturned boats, sinking vessels, and for search and rescue operations when these bodies of water are at their most treacherous. The boat is also used to deploy wildland firefighters and equipment into remote areas.

This project replaces a 28 year-old inflatable that has had numerous repairs and will no longer hold air. It is well beyond its usable life span. The rescue boat project is a rigid hull inflatable/air filled foam boat (tested to U.S. Coast Guard standards), motor and trailer.

The CES board passed a motion, recommending acceptance of the grant at its regular board meeting held May 17, 2012. The Alaska Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development will provide the grant award with a five-year project performance period ending June 30, 2017. The CES chief shall provide grant oversight and project completion.

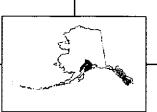

Ordinance 2012-19- 12 an ordinance accepting and appropriating a grant in the amount of \$2,000,000 from the State of Alaska on behalf of the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area for the Radiation Oncology Facility Construction Project

Legislative grant funding in the Fiscal Year 2012/2013 State of Alaska Capital Budget was requested for the purpose of completing the Central Peninsula Hospital Radiation Oncology Facility Construction Project. Senate Bill 160 which appropriated funding in the amount of \$2,000,000 for the project was passed by the State Legislature and signed by Governor Parnell on May 14, 2012.

Through O2011-19-72 the assembly approved and appropriated funds in the amount of \$4,700,000 from the CPH Plant Replacement and Expansion Fund for the project, enabling the project construction to commence during the 2012 construction season. The legislative award will reduce the CPH Plant Replacement and Expansion Fund funding for this project in the amount of \$2,000,000.

The service area board passed a motion recommending acceptance of the grant at its regular board meeting held June 4, 2012. The AK Dept. of Commerce, Community and Economic Development will provide two grant awards, a legislative award in the amount of \$1,000,000 and a re-appropriated funds award in the amount of \$1,000,000. Each award has a five-year, project performance period ending June 30, 2017. Kevin Lyon, Capital Projects Director, shall provide grant oversight and project completion.

The borough submitted a request for legislative grant funding in the Fiscal Year 2012/2013 State of Alaska Capital Budget. Senate Bill 160 was passed by the State Legislature and signed by Governor Parnell on May 14, 2012, appropriating \$1,000,000 for the hazardous tree removal project.

As excerpted in the "2012 State Funding Priorities" binder page 3:

Funds will be used to implement a project aimed at the removal of hazard trees outside and adjacent to utility easements and rights-of way corridors. [...] The borough has collaborated with HEA to combine its utility infrastructure mapping with LIDAR vegetation mapping to determine where potential hazards exist adjacent to utility easements and right-of way corridors. These funds would allow: (1) the Borough to continue working with electric utility companies, as needed to identify the area where power lines and rights-of-way are susceptible to hazard trees; (2) to contact and enter into written authorization for removal of such hazard trees with the property owners; and (3) to administer contracts for mitigation efforts in a manner

Purchase of subject property was approved at the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District's ("KPBSD") Board of Education meeting of May 7, 2012 (see attached meeting summary). The KPBSD wishes to expand the Aurora Borealis Charter School ("ABCS") with the purchase of adjacent land. Over the years the ABCS's playground space has been reduced due to the addition of two portables. season, prior to the new school year. As only one assembly meeting is scheduled for July, shortened hearing is respectfully requested. This would allow the land to be put to use during the next school year.

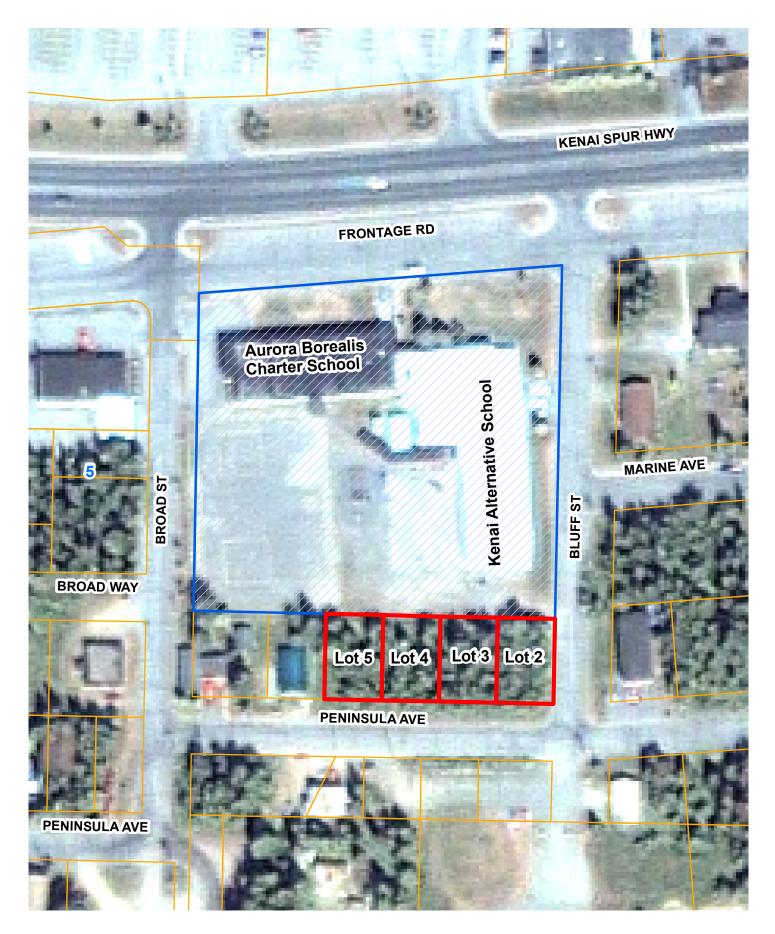
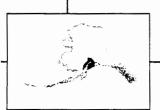




Exhibit -- Area Map

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

SCHOOL BOARD COMMUNICATION

The usable ABCS playground space has been reduced over the years due to the addition of two portables. There are six lots that adjoin the playground (04711802-04711807). Four of the lots do not have structures (04711804-04711807) and the owners have indicated an interest in the sale of the four at the current assessed value of \$21,200 per lot, for a total of \$84,800. The owners of the two lots that have structures were sent letters inquiring as to their interest in trading for borough property of equal value. They have not responded.

Acquisition of the four lots would make available much needed space for both playground and an area to put a storage building that would be utilized by both the Kenai Alternative School and Aurora Borealis Charter School (ABCS).

ABCS has funds available in account number 100-65-4600-0000-5101 to purchase the four lots. The Academic Policy Committee of ABCS requested approval from the Charter School Oversight Committee to pursue purchase or trade for the property through the Kenai Peninsula Borough. Permission was granted.

The Seward Bear Creek Flood Service Area (SBCFSA) has identified nine parcels of land in common ownership to acquire for the purposes of flood mitigation. Land Management has negotiated a Purchase Agreement for these parcels at their assessed values.

The SBCFSA board at its October 3, 2011 meeting unanimously passed a motion recommending spending up to \$30,000 to purchase property along Salmon Creek. Subsequent discussions with the Army Corp of Engineers unveiled additional monies, known as in-lieu fee monies, that are available through The Conservation Fund. The Conservation Fund, which is a non-profit organization, will contribute \$215,700 to purchase an additional five parcels. These parcels will have restrictions that ensure the protection of wetland habitat. The four parcels purchased with SBCFSA funds will have an unrestricted title.

The attached ordinance appropriates \$27,700 from the SBCFSA for this acquisition and approves the purchase of four parcels with SBCFSA funds and five parcels to be purchased with The Conservation Fund's inlieu fee monies. Your consideration of this ordinance is appreciated.

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Purchase Agreement ("Agreement") is effective on this _____ day of _____, 2012, by and between JAMES A. WHEREAS, subject to Assembly authorization and appropriation of funds, KPB has offered to buy and SELLER is willing to sell the Property as evidenced by this Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises herein contained, SELLER hereby agrees to sell to KPB and KPB hereby agrees to buy from SELLER the Property on the terms and conditions as set forth below:

1. PURCHASE PRICE

The purchase price of the Property is Two Hundred Forty One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars and NO cents (\$241,200.00). The purchase price shall be paid by KPB at time of closing. The purchase of the Property and appropriation for the purchase are subject to borough assembly approval.

2. TITLE

Title shall be delivered at time of closing by Warranty Deed, which shall be issued to KPB substantially in the form of exhibits B&C attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein. SELLER warrants and covenants that at the time of closing there shall be no liens or judgments recorded against SELLER in the same recording district in which the Property subject to this Agreement is situated. Title shall be clear of liens and encumbrances except title is subject to reservations, easements, rights-of-way, covenants, conditions and restrictions of record.

3. ESCROW AND CLOSING COSTS

In addition to the purchase price, KPB agrees to pay for one-half closing costs in connection with this Agreement, including without limitation all escrow fees, title insurance charges, recording fees and bank charges up to \$2,500. Property taxes will be prorated. All costs will be paid in full at the time of closing.

4. CLOSING

Unless otherwise agreed in writing, closing will occur within 90 days of execution of the Purchase Agreement. At closing, KPB will pay the balance of the purchase price. Both parties will execute all documents required to complete the Purchase Agreement and, if applicable, establish an escrow account.

POSSESSION

Possession shall be delivered to KPB at time of recording.

6. KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY APPROVAL

Purchase of the Property by the Kenai Peninsula Borough is subject to authorization by the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly and appropriation of funds. If the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly fails to authorize the purchase of the subject land and appropriate funds, this Agreement shall be terminated without penalty.

7. HAZARDOUS MATERIAL

SELLER covenants, to the best of SELLER'S knowledge, that as of the date of this Agreement, except as specifically identified herein, the Property is free of all contamination from petroleum products or any hazardous substance or hazardous waste, as defined by applicable state or federal law, and there are no underground storage tanks or associated piping on the Property. SELLER agrees that no hazardous substances or wastes shall be located on or stored on the Property or any adjacent property by SELLER, owner or contractors, nor shall any such substance be owned, stored, used, or disposed of on the Property or any adjacent property by SELLER, its agents, employees, contractors, or invitee's prior to KPB'S ownership, possession, or control of the Property.

8. INSPECTION

SELLER hereby authorizes KPB its contractor or Agent to enter the Property for the purpose of conducting physical inspection of the Property which may include digging holes provided that the Property is returned to its original condition.

9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement and the documents referred to herein contain the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. Any changes, additions or deletions hereto must be made in writing and signed by both KPB and SELLER or their respective successors in interest. Provisions of this

Agreement, unless inapplicable on their face, shall be covenants constituting term and conditions of the sale and shall continue in full force and effect until the purchase price is paid in full or this Agreement is earlier terminated.

10. BREACH REMEDY

Prior to Closing of the sale, in the event that KPB or SELLER fails to make any payment required or fails to submit or execute any and all documents and papers necessary for closing and transfer of title within the time period specified in this Agreement, either SELLER or KPB may terminate this Agreement.

11. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Time. Time is of the essence in performance of this Agreement.
- B. Cancellation. This Agreement, while in good standing, may be canceled in whole or in part, at any time, upon mutual written agreement by SELLER and the KPB mayor. This Agreement is subject to cancellation in whole or in part if improperly issued through error in procedure or with respect to material facts.
- C. Notice. Any notice or demand, which under the terms of this Agreement or under any statute must be given or made by the parties hereto, shall be in writing and be given or made by registered or certified mail, addressed to the their party at the address shown in this Agreement. However, either party may designate in writing such other address to which such notice of demand shall thereafter be so given, made or mailed. A notice given hereunder shall be deemed received when deposited in a U.S. general or branch post office by the addresser.
- D. Interpretation. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been jointly drafted by both parties. It shall be construed according to the fair intent of the language as a whole, not for or against any party. The interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Alaska. The titles of sections in this Agreement are not be to construed as limitations of definitions but are for identification purposes only.

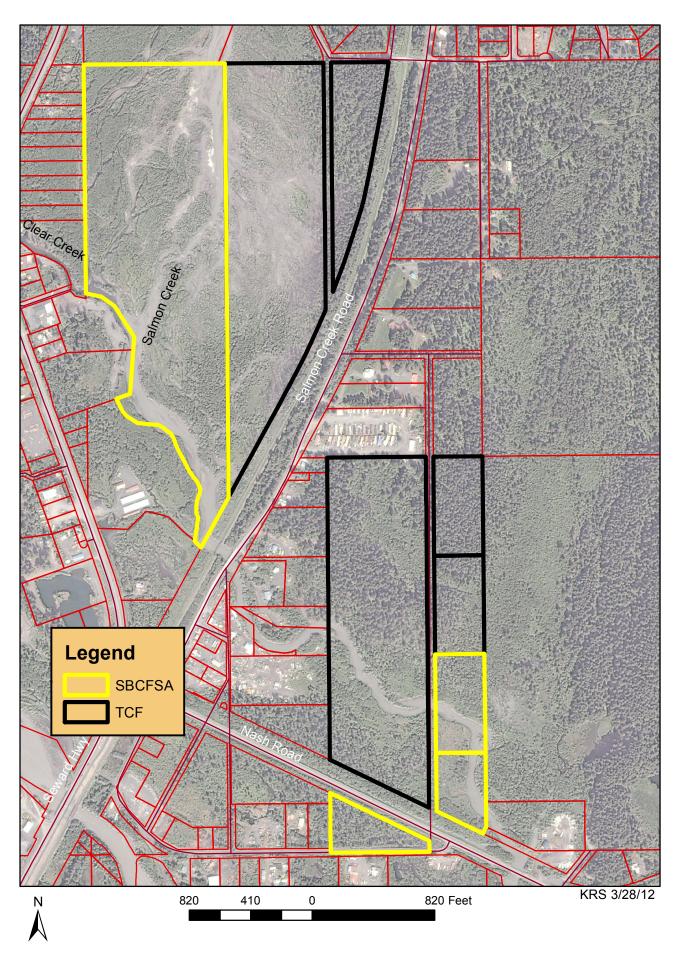

At the October 3, 2011 regular board meeting for the Seward/Bear Creek Flood Service Area, a motion to purchase for \$30,000 property owned by James Stewart, et al. passed unanimously.

The Service Area submitted a request for the 2012 State Capital Improvement Projects for the acquisition of flood prone properties along Salmon Creek. This request included the nine parcels of land owned by James Stewart, et al. The Service Area was presented with an opportunity to partner with The Conservation Fund to acquire these properties with Section 404 Clean Water Act compensatory mitigation funds. This partnership will meet the Service Area goal of preventing future flood damage by prohibiting new development within the floodplain.

MEETING MINUTES 3 October 2011

A. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:00PM.

B. ROLL CALL

C. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Chairman Bill Williamson called for approval of the agenda.

Vice Chairman Bob White moved to approve the agenda as written.

The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

D. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Meeting minutes from 9/26/11 not yet available.

E. REPORTS

• Kenai Peninsula Borough

Sue McClure, KPB Assembly Member reported Seward's Assistant City Manager has resigned. She does not know what the status of city involvement will be during the transition with city manager, assistant city manager and with the pending election. She has already talked to city council members about making one of the vacant board seats an "at large" seat to be filled by a resident of the city or the service area. She asked for a letter to the city council requesting one of the city seats be changed to an at large seat. She stated this was a good compromise. She stated she was happy the Borough came over to respond to the flooding and has heard reactions from residents complementing the borough with all the attention they have been paying to our area.

• Dan Mahalak, Water Resources Manager, KPB River Center stated he had nothing to report.

F. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Bob Valdatta stated his property out on Sawmill Creek upstream of Nash road flooded during the last rain. There was water in his house. A neighbor has removed gravel from upstream.

G. BOARD'S RESPONSE TO PUBLIC COMMENTS

Bill Williamson asked Dan Mahalak to go take a look to see what it will take to get a permit. No one should do anything until the current situation is done.

Randy Stauffer commented that the City of Seward should be kept as a permanent line item on the agenda under Reported to give a venue for the City to report. Added he agreed with Sue McClure's comment about creating an at large seat is a good compromise. He asked if the board needs to vote on creating a letter for Sue to take to the city council.

Bill Williamson stated the board has already taken action on this.

Mac Eads commented that we had just missed a flood. It was close, it was coming over the bank and running down the driveway. Thankfully the sun started to shine.

Matt Hall commented he was almost off the flood board, and was sad he got the call from Stephanie who promised cookies.

Bob White commented that Sawmill Creek was one of the pieces left out of the latest US Army Corps of Engineer's Planning Assistance to Stated Report. Mr. Valdatta is one of the dwellings at risk there. There is also a tipping point in Glacier Creek. It is important to keep maintenance in the upper reaches of Kwechak Creek to protect that area.

H. CORRESPONDENCE & PAYMENT REQUESTS

• Borough Mayor Letter
Stephanie Presley reported a letter from the Mayor was received the 26th.

Bill Williamson stated the letter was addressed to him. He has asked for a chance to speak to the mayor and the phone call has not been returned. As discussed last week, in an area out by Bear Creek, the water was messing with the tracks. The people where the water broke through behind their house called. There was a response from Bear Creek, and there was no immediate danger, but they did not see where the water

was going and where it was ending up at the lower end of the valley. Mr. Williamson went out to look and the water was underneath the rails on the railroad, so he called Mr. Dieckgraeff to put a 9 in to plug the hole, to braid the stream back to keep it from going down one channel. The neighbors had called Emergency Management and they had been told OEM would need up to five days before they could get a permit to come down to respond. Mr. Williamson made the judgment call to put the cat in. He did not call the River Center because he did not have time and had to get back to work. Two hours later, Mr. Bevington drove over and told him to get out of the creek, and they did. This is the consequence of not having a permit. The next page is an email John Mohorcich sent for the service area needs to do to make the calculations to get the right permit. The next page is a bill from Metco to do the work for \$1,275. He would like the board to approve payment, otherwise he will pay it himself.

Metco Payment

Randy Stauffer asked if Mr. Williamson called Metco as a representative of the flood service board.

Bill Williamson answered yes, he felt he was representing the board, because he was called by citizens to take a look because no one in the borough was doing anything. If the board is concerned about the property owners, he has a management agreement with the property owners to maintain any work needed for the property at risk.

Bob White stated if the Borough was concerned or responsive to the board, other than saying five days. The work done by the Borough in Clear Creek took a lot of screaming and yelling to get work done when houses and businesses completely surrounded by water. Because this happened late in the season, properties didn't lose money, but it has happened in the past. The Borough stonewalling or ignorance is frustrating and about time for it to be done with. Taking the action to save the Railroad, the Highway and Bear Creek Fire Department, and we get spanked for it. He doesn't agree with it.

Matt Hall commented it takes the Borough five days for them to get a permit, but we hop in the creek and it takes them two hours to get over here.

John Eads commented that a flood doesn't give a person time to get all those permits. We have to do the work when we can.

Bob White stated that we need cooperation from the Borough, we do not need them to fight with us.

Bob White called for a motion to pay the bill.

Randy Stauffer seconded the motion. He commented if the board votes to pay this bill, it might be appropriate to respond with a letter to the River Center, explaining

officially why these actions were taken and why it was necessary. The letters from the Mayor and the Floodplain Administrator saying we were in the creek without a permit are true, and if they are in fact doing their job, they have to write these letters, because if it comes down to the issue of does the borough enforce these rules, these letters indicate they do want to enforce the permits. They picked a time to enforce the permits that was inappropriate.

Bill Williamson responded that he was more than willing to accept a citation, admitted to taking this action, and the Borough representative was told why it was necessary at the time, but Mr. Mohorcich decided to go further with it.

Randy Stauffer stated that since we are responsible for tax payer money, we need to put on record why we needed to do the work.

Dan Mahalak reported we received an email from River Center staff and other regulatory agencies involved in the permitting asking for us to provide some basic pre and post information of the activities of the 21st to receive a permit for the work. The Kwechak Creek permit listed later on the agenda is being held up until this issue is resolved.

Bob White suggested sending a notification to all the people who are at risk due to the lack of the work being done up Kwechak Creek, saying the Borough is being obstructionist in preventing future flooding in the area, and give the phone numbers for people to call.

The motion was unanimously approved.

I. PERMITS FOR REVIEW

Kwechak Creek Project

Dan Mahalak reported we filed for a permit last Friday to complete work in Kwechak Creek. This permit has been placed on AI status "additional information required". Conditional information is required to show the pre-existing conditions the area was in before the work was completed. This permit is in "AI" because it encompasses the same area where the unauthorized work took place.

Randy Stauffer asked what information was requested on September 23rd by the River Center.

Dan Mahalak reported what information had been requested.

Randy Stauffer stated the board needs to explain what was done, and why it was done. The board should provide what information we have. If the River Center wants to hold up other permitting, then he agrees with Mr. White that it is obstructionism.

Bob White asked if the work done two weeks prior by the Office of Emergency Management aggravated this problem. They have some culpability as well if they did the work due to flawed engineering or advice.

Bill Williamson responded that due to the way the gravel was moved, it was unbalanced and made the river move to one side. The amount of money appropriated for the emergency response was not enough. After the emergency work, he wanted to have a meeting to appropriate money to continue the work downstream and finish the project, but there was no meeting. They weren't able to finish the job due to lack of funds, and the board was not able to meet and vote on finishing the project.

Randy Stauffer stated that all this needs to be put into our report.

Bill Williamson stated he will work with Dan to get this finished. The permit application on page 5 of the packet for the proposed area is to go back and repair the problem we have right now.

Randy Stauffer asked if the board had already approved this work two years ago, but because of permitting, we haven't been able to do it.

Dan Mahalak responded the board did approve work to be done in Kwechak, the work was done with a D9 pushing up both sides, and it hasn't been done again.

Bill Williamson added that the board did approve work up above the bridge, but this permit application is for work below the bridge.

Dan Mahalak stated that this project should not take more than two days.

Randy Stauffer asked what kind of funds are needed and if the board has funds available.

Stephanie Presley stated she does not have the financial report with her, but that we do have funds available and will check after the meeting.

Dan Mahalak stated it should take about \$10,000.

Bob White moved to fund the project for \$10,000 cap.

The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

J. OLD BUSINESS

• Stewart Properties

Bill Williamson stated that last week a motion was on the table to purchase the 53 acre parcel for \$30,000.

Oliver Kunitake asked to see what the entire three parcels would cost.

Bob White responded that the information was on the sheet he gave Mr. Kunitake.

Bill Williamson asked for a motion to purchase the 53 acres, so if there is another problem in Clear Creek, the board can go in there and do the work that needs to be done.

Randy Stauffer moved to offer to purchase the 53 acres.

Matt Hall seconded the motion.

Randy Stauffer commented that the board is using local funds to purchase the property and the land is going to the Borough, and the land will be owned by all the citizens of the Borough, even though local citizens will pay for it. He asked what guarantees does the board have from the Borough to be able to utilize the land for flood mitigation projects or possibly to store materials. He asked what the board could do to ensure the land be used for the benefit of this community.

Bill Williamson stated the reason land is being bought is for flood mitigation. He added that somewhere in the language, maybe with Borough Land Management, or the assembly, there should be a written contract that this land should be put into a land bank and could not be sold again. He stated there may need to be a resolution and that tonight the board is voting to purchase the land, but the board should investigate language that will set it aside for flood mitigation.

Bob White stated the board may be able to use the same stipulations in the Old Mill buyout as far as what can be stored there, and what it can be used for. He added one flaw in that agreement is that the board cannot store materials on the land. He stated an agreement should be possible so the board can use the land for flood mitigation. He added there is a lot of gravel coming down Salmon Creek that will need to be moved out of the way.

Randy Stauffer asked if the board obtains this land, will the board have access to it.

Bill Williamson stated there are two lots owned by the Borough and there can be access to that property. The board would not need to come in from the other side.

Bob White commented there may need a bridge because there is a stream there.

Randy Stauffer asked if the board can get across there, not a political problem, but if there is a natural problem.

Bob White stated that a CAT could get through there.

Bill Williamson stated that there is access.

Oliver Kunitake's comments that the board could come in from his property.

Bill Williamson stated that the board could draw up a waiver or an agreement for access to get across his property.

Dan Mahalak shared LIDAR cross section data across two of the parcels. He stated part of the problem at the Clear Creek/Salmon Creek confluence is that the river is higher than the adjacent ground. He stated that to have any kind of effect, the board will need to purchase both properties.

Bob White asked if the other property was put on the wish list.

Bill Williamson stated that the board put this property and others downstream on the capital projects request for the Borough. He added that as the year goes on, the board may have funds available to purchase the other parcel. He stated one of the problems may be that the Office of Emergency Management is about out of money and it looks to them as if the board has a huge bank account. The Borough doesn't want to spend their money over here, and the service area has money and they think the board should be spending it.

Randy Stauffer commented he was surprised by Erik Mohrmann's statement they had used over 50% of Emergency Management funds on the two projects over here. It turned out to be less than \$25,000. He stated if that is all that has been appropriated for emergency response for a fiscal year, then the borough is in a heap of trouble considering wild fires. He continued it was an interesting statement, and he can understand that if Emergency Management has that little funds that he doesn't want to spend their money over here.

Bob White stated \$50,000 is typical and they live on the dependency of disaster declarations to take care of the real work.

Bill Williamson stated the motion on table is to purchase or not the 53 acres.

The motion was unanimously approved.

• Capital Projects Request

Stephanie Presley reported drafts of the two capital projects were in the packet. The first is the bed load removal that has been requested the last several years. The second is for purchase of 22 properties to be along Salmon Creek for flood mitigation.

Bob White stated there is one more property in Old Mill, not on the buyout list, due west of Judy Rowe's property. If the board would like to do maintenance out there and haul material, it could be stored there. He continued the property is currently for sale, and someone cleared it and was going to build there. It would be big enough to store materials, and it could be used to put scrapers in there. He stated the board can't leave materials on any of the properties already bought out there.

Randy Stauffer commented that both projects are about \$1,000,000. He asked if the board was going to request one project around \$400,000, so there was some option other than \$1,000,000.

Stephanie Presley reported the assessed value of the 22 properties on the screen add up to \$1,200,000, and with the funds the board has been setting aside to match a large project, the project would come up to \$1,000,000 plus those funds.

Bill Williamson commented we should cut the properties in half and put in for the other half next year.

Bob White asked why the three parcels in a row on the south side of Nash Road were included, and if the board was going to try to let water go under Nash Road.

Bill Williamson stated the board was looking there to get some relief underneath the highway. He asked if there is money available for culverts.

Dan Mahalak reported he had been told that if the board could ascertain property on the south side of Nash Road the board may be able to obtain matching funds for culverts to go through Nash Road.

Bob White commented the impact could be pretty huge because Old Nash is lower than the new Nash. He stated he can see a long fight with those property owners, not to mention the liability if they flooded. He added the two properties on the south side of the road, the hook at the curve of the system, are the only parcels that the board could have an effect. He suggested an additional hundred foot span where the bridge currently exists.

Randy Stauffer stated the board was talking about details, but for the purpose of the capital projects, there are a number of properties to buy to make sure people don't develop those. He stated he was not making comments on Mr. White's comments, but for the purpose of the capital projects, the board may have one of lesser amount.

Dan Mahalak asked if he should send some maps to the board to prioritize properties.

Stephanie Presley stated these requests were due before next meeting.

Bill Williamson commented the board may put in for \$500,000 and take the numbers of properties down. He continued the idea was to start and work down from the confluence of Salmon and Clear Creek and start working down to Resurrection River. Put in for \$500,000 to get it out of the floodplain.

Bob White added to get the properties out of potential development.

Randy Stauffer stated the board should cut this back to \$500,000 or \$600,000 and pick the properties and decide what are the priorities.

Bill Williamson asked Dan Mahalak if he could do this.

Dan Mahalak clarified that he should start at the Stewart Properties and work south until it totaled about \$500,000 of assessed values.

Seward PAS Report/ USACE Meeting

Bill Williamson asked Mr. Mahalak when the USACE meeting would be.

Dan Mahalak reported he had talked to them today, and they are in receipt of verbal comments from the last meeting, combined with the PAS study team members and let them know we need to schedule a meeting. He added he will send the meeting time out via email and would request some board members attend. He stated verbatim from the Corps that if the board wants the Corps to implement any construction projects, the service area will need to conduct another study. The meeting can be scheduled around everyone's schedule and will be held in the service area office.

Bill Williamson stated the some board members will need to attend that meeting.

K. NEW BUSINESS

There was none at this time.

L. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS AND REPORTED (No action required)

• Coordinator out of office
Stephanie Presley reported she will attend the Kenai Watershed Symposium.

M. PUBLIC COMMENT

Bob Valdetta commented he doesn't remember when anyone got onto the city about the flood from Ben's Store, where the Y is, from there on to the beach, there's supposed to be someone doing work there every year and no one has ever put pressure on them. He asked where the culverts sitting on Blaine's property are going.

Dan Mahalak reported they are replacing the culverts currently under Salmon Creek Road.

Bob Valdetta asked if they put those in if Mac's would be doubly flooded.

Bob White responded the ditch will get inundated with water, but no worse than it already does. He stated the problem is if that passage is not there, then it all has to go underneath the bridge, then it over banks at Ava's. By giving it more passage, what will happened in a high water event is the railroad and Salmon Creek Road will become a channel to those culvert for that water to get out. He explained what the board is trying to accomplish with that is to get passage down lower and then get focus on passage either by depending the channel under the bridge or putting more passage underneath He further explained the purpose for buying the properties adjacent to Salmon Creek at Nash Road so there can be more passage through the road. The road is a dam.

Bob Valdatta stated he could give written access across his property.

Bill Williamson stated the service area has a wavier that Mr. Valdatta could sign.

Oliver Kunitake commented that he would want to know what are the conditions the board would want for transaction in the future. He added if the board can get a basic easement, it would be a miracle, but if it can be done, so be it, and maybe the board has a bit more clout.

Bob Reisner asked if the board puts in larger culvert on Salmon Creek, what kind of pressure it would that put on Glen's property on the downstream bank

Dan Mahalak stated the conveyance calculation requires that you have to not raise the surface water elevation one foot or less than a one foot rise.

Bill Williamson added that there is only so much water that can come through the railroad culverts.

Dan Mahalak stated the purpose is to lower the surface water elevation of any given flood. The only way to truly reap the reward would be to put holes through Nash Road, under twenty foot, otherwise have to go through DOT, that hasn't happened yet because of those individual property owners on the downstream side. Trying to find a project that fulfills the mission of flood planning, protection and mitigation services on a tax levy fair use of watershed wide benefit, that is the number one project that the board could for the service area. We also have a document from 1995 discussing reducing the backwater effects due to infrastructure. In that report, they mentioned the levee road being built and discussed the three railroad bridges increases and some other issues that have all been accomplished. So this is the last piece of the puzzle that hasn't happened yet and the service area is doing it on their own.

N. BOARD COMMENT

Bob White commented on Mr. Valdetta's statement and said that the service area had repeatedly brought up the issue of failure of the Borough and the City to maintain the 1998 dredging which they signed in writing and have not funded since. The specific area is not very far below the bridge. The board has mentioned it to DOT and someone could bring it to the attention of Council, but the Borough assembly needs to be aware of the contract they signed also.

Randy Stauffer wished to thank Ms. McClure for moving forward on a solution for the lack of board members. He commented on permitting issues with the River Center, obviously we have to play by the rules and obviously have to protect property in this area, because that is what the people expect the board to do.

John Eads had no comment.

Matt Hall stated if anyone writes him in on the ballot during the election, he is going to hunt them down.

Bill Williamson asked Sue McClure about ordinance 2011-19 to do with coastal management, but he thought coastal management was dissolved by the Governor.

Sue McClure responded she would follow up on it next meeting, but she thought it was an existing modeling project, and was not a lot of money that carried over because it had not been expended.

O. ADJOURNMENT

Bob White moved that the meeting be adjourned.

The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

services areas to obtain an energy audit

Following enactment of ordinance 2011-30 on September 6, 2011, which implemented an energy conservation program for the Kenai Peninsula Borough service areas, the administration has taken steps to comply with the requirements. It prepared and submitted the energy policy guide to the assembly which was approved on February 14, 2012. Additionally, the capital projects department has worked on a request for proposals to conduct the required energy audits the estimated funding for which was included in the FY2013 budget. Currently the code requires that these audits be completed by September 6, 2012.

The capital projects department expects to be ready to issue a request for proposals to conduct the required energy audits in July 2012. However, it has been determined that most energy audits include infrared photography which identifies heat loss on the building envelope, and these are best completed in the winter. Also, a significant amount of work is required to conduct the audits, including data gathering, site visits, finding the recommended upgrades, completing a return on investment analysis, and issuing the draft and final reports.

Given this information the administration respectfully requests the assembly authorize an extension of time until January 31, 2013, to complete the energy audits. It anticipates this will result in audits based on more complete data and would contain a more thorough analysis. The January 31, 2013, deadline also provides the service area boards with time to consider the information and decide how much funds to request for the energy conservation measures they choose to request. Shortened hearing is requested as the next assembly meeting is August 7, 2012, and the administration needs to know before then whether the additional time is approved. Your approval of this ordinance is respectfully requested.
