ORDINANCE 80-39

AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF \$2,500,000 OF UNEXPENDED FUNDS APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 77-51, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, IMPROVING AND EQUIPPING THE NIKOLAEVSK SCHOOL ADDITION AND THE NINILCHIK SCHOOL ADDITION.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 77-51 was enacted by the Assembly and approved by the voters at an election authorizing indebtedness by the issuance of general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$25,970,000 for the purpose of constructing, equipping improvements at Anchor Point School, Sterling School, Homer High School, Tustumena School, Soldotna High School, and the new Soldotna Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, these enumerated projects have all been completed or provided for from the proceeds of that bond issue without expending all of the proceeds of the bond issue; and

WHEREAS, \$2,500,000 remains as an unexpended balance from the proceeds of that bond issue; and

WHEREAS, Wohlforth and Flint, the Borough's bond counsel for that bond issue of 1977 has advised that the unexpended balance may be used for additional school construction and improvements so long as the projects authorized by the Assembly and the voters have been completed or provided for; and

WHEREAS, the School Board has recommended against a major bond issue in the year 1980, but has recommended the use of this unexpended balance to go forward with necessary

improvements at Ninilchik and Nikolaevsk Schools.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the \$2,500,000 in unexpended funds authorized by Ordinance 77-51, enacted by the Assembly on August 16, 1977, and approved by a majority of those voting on the question at the regular election of October 4, 1977, shall be utilized for the purpose of constructing, improving and equipping the Nikolaevsk School Addition and the Ninilchik School Addition as recommended by the Borough School Board, together with such other revenues which may be properly expended for these projects.

Section 2. This ordinance takes effect immediately upon its enactment.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE 80-39 BY ASSEMBLYMAN FISCHER

I firmly believe that the voters of the Borough should pass upon and authorize the expenditure of these unexpended monies from the bond issue of October, 1977, and I offer the following amendments:

I move to strike the WHEREAS clause which refers to the opinion of bond counsel that the voters' approval is not necessary, and I move to amend <u>Section 2</u> to read as follows:

"This ordinance takes effect on the day following enactment, subject to approval by a majority of those voting on the question at the regular election to be held in the Borough on October 7, 1980."

Add new Section 3:

Section 3. The proposition on the ballot shall read as follows:

PROPOSITION

"Shall Ordinance 80-39 be approved to authorize the Kenai Peninsula Borough to expend \$2,500,000 in unexpended funds authorized by Ordinance 77-51, for the purpose of constructing, improving and equipping the Nikolaevsk School Addition and the Ninilchik School Addition, together with such other revenues as may properly be expended for these projects."

Per our discussion, April 29, 1980, the following cost estimates are submitted for the revised scope of work outlined for the Nikolaevsk and Ninilchik Schools. I have discussed the estimates with Gary Spring of Design Lab for clarification of their letter of March 6, 1980. Contingencies included in their construction figures have been identified separately in my breakdown. Soils and testing estimates have been increased to include necessary legal, administrative, construction administration, and normal reimbursables. A line item for furnishings has also been included. I have adjusted the project contingencies so the two projects total \$2,500,000.
