





Forty-six percent (46%) of all parcels on unmanaged anadromous streams are privately owned. Adding the unmanaged streams to KPB 21.18 would result in a 54% increase of parcels to manage.




Seventy-one percent (71%) of all privately owned parcels on currently managed streams are already improved/developed. On unmanaged streams, the number of already improved/developed properties drops to forty-one percent (41%).



Of the 2,973 total miles of anadromous streams in the Kenai Peninsula Borough, about 20% (602) are currently managed by the Borough.
