Dear Mayor Carey,

Enclosed is a copy of the "denial" letter I received on Thursday, May 5, 2011. Does the Borough Assembly ever make decisions based on "hardship" cases?

Here is the situation: I have lived in a child care business home for 34 out of 38 years. I was finally able to purchase a Terry Franke home, as a personal residence, in December 2009 due to 3 things: 1) Receiving Social Security, 2) \$6,500 help from the government to purchase a second home, and 3) The Senior Property Tax Exemption.

Shortly after the new year in 2010 I went to the Borough to fill out an application for senior tax exemption. I was told it could not be done due to the fact that I would not be 65 until June 20th. "You can apply next year."

When I spoke with Ms. Guzman on the 5<sup>th</sup> she said I could have filled out an application back in 2010 and it would have been held. I was not informed of that at the time. The clerk who waited on me was eager to go on her "break" and I felt rushed. Had I been told of that option it certainly would have been in my best interest to file at the time.

This past January and February, while I did not have a specific illness I was going through a regiment of testing and checkups. My application was filed 17 days late.

I have lived in Soldotna, and operated an on-going business, since November 1977. We were the first licensed child care facility on the whole Kenai Peninsula. At that time, there were 903 applicants waiting for phone service, no paved roads, no franchise businesses or stoplights. And now, at almost 66, I find myself frustrated! All of the foregoing years I have paid property taxes, sales taxes (until child care services became exempt), and supported my community through buying locally, attending fund raisers, etc.

My business and home are both Terry Franke financed which means there is no escrow account so I, as a single woman, am responsible for property taxes and insurance.

Yes, last year it was my mistake in assuming I would be exempt from property taxes on my new home. I was able to comply by not paying quarterly payroll taxes to the IRS for the last 2 quarters and so now I am making payments to them so I could accommodate you. I am devastated to be repeating the same scenario as last year. Therefore my question regarding a "hardship" case and could I possibly qualify?

In all honesty I can tell you my NET INCOME each year is \$13,000-\$14,000, which can be verified by my tax returns. That does not leave a lot of wiggle room.

If there is not a possibility of a "hardship case" being approved, would you please set me up on a monthly payment plan to offset the roughly \$4,000 due in the fall?

Thank you for your consideration of this matter.

Dear Mrs. Bailey:

The Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly denied acceptance of your late-filed 2011 Senior Citizen Exemption application at their May 3, 2011, regular meeting.

The Assembly upheld Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) Code 5.12.105 in the decision to deny accepting late filed applications when the reason for being late was not for "good cause" as defined in KPB code. KPB code 5.12.105 in part states:

Exemption applications filed after February 15 of the tax year must be accompanied by a signed affidavit stating good cause for fallure to comply with the February 15 filing deadline. If a qualified senior citizen or disabled veteran files an untimely application, the assembly may, for good cause shown, waive the claimant's failure to make timely application and authorize the Assessor to accept the applications as if timely filed.

(4) Good cause shown. Good cause for failure to file by February 15, for purposes of this subsection, include but are not limited to extended travel out of state, medical conditions, health related conditions, family medical needs or emergencies, or other similar causes that reasonably prevented the applicant from timely filing. Absent extraordinary circumstances, a mere failure to pick up or read mail or to make arrangements for an appropriate and responsible person to pick up or read mail or a failure to timely provide a current address to the Department of Assessing will not be deemed good cause.

I will hold your application and review if for eligibility for the 2012 assessment year.
