Can this be added to the packets of all assembly members, for tonight's meeting?

Regarding Ordinance 2011-19-70: Appropriating \$200,000 to Hire a Consultant to Assist the Borough in Determining the Course of Action to Pursue Regarding Curtailing Health Care Costs (Mayor) (Referred to Finance Committee):

How will this proposed study differ from the recent similar study done by the State of Alaska? Spending \$200,000 to study this issue LOCALLY, is a waste of time and money. The Mayor should study the results of the STATE study, before spending more Borough money for information that may already exist at the state level. Voters WILL be looking very closely, to see where this \$200,000 is spent and who is hired to do it.

Regarding Ordinance 2011-19-72: Appropriating \$4,700,000 for the Purpose of Constructing a Radiation Oncology Facility at Central Peninsula Hospital (Mayor) (Referred to Finance Committee):

I object to earmarking this huge amount BEFORE negotiations are completed by both parties. We should see final proposals as to this issue before ANY Borough money is committed. If no solution between the hospital and the doctors is arrived at, that is the time to consider this HUGE amount.

Why isn't this money coming out of the large surplus fund the hospital has built up?

Isn't there a 1.5 million dollar limit the Assembly can request before adding this HUGE amount on to the taxpayers? I thought an initiative limiting the amount the Borough could spend without voter approval, is still a law?

Regarding Ordinance 2011-19-73: Appropriating \$569,292 from the Equipment Replacement Fund for the Purchase of New Sales Tax Software (Mayor) (Referred to Finance Committee)

I object to the purchase of NEW sales tax software until the people have been given adequate reasons for this expenditure. This seems like a LOT of money for a software program. I thought we just bought new software a few years ago. Why isn't that adequate? Didn't it bring in enough money?

Will this 'new software' become obsolete in a few years?

Was there any examination done to see if a comparable program might be found that costs less?

Is this just another way the new Mayor shows his disregard for the voters intent to SAVE MONEY, NOT SPEND MORE?

Regarding Ordinance 2012-07: Amending KPB Titles 2-Administration, 4--Elections and 16--Service Areas to Provide that All Kenai Peninsula Borough Service Area Boards are Appointed Instead of Elected (Murphy) (Hearings on 04/03/12 and 04/17/12) (Referred to Policies and Procedures Committee)

THIS IS OUTRAGEOUS! The PEOPLE should select who is on these Boards, NOT the Assembly.

Is this just one more POWER GRAB by the Assembly? If you pass this, legal action WILL follow, and MORE MONEY will be needed to defend this in court.

I ask the Assembly to re-think this horrible idea and shelve it for good!

Regarding Resolution 2011-108: Approving a New Senior Clerk Typist Classified Position in the River Center Department (Mayor) (Referred to Policies and Procedures Committee) TABLED 01/17/12

Again, our new Mayor seems to never run out of ways to spend more money. Will there be NO END to ways you can spend money on the River Center? What will ever be ENOUGH?

Times are HARD for a lot of Borough residents, and spending more money on NON ESSENTIAL ITEMS does not help.

Have you looked into ways PAPER WORK could be reduced, or whether existing employees are being used efficiently? Maybe some Department heads could type some of their own work? If they had to do it, maybe they would think twice before adding new regulations and policies that just generate more paperwork and justify hiring more people.

Is there ANY stipulation that this new position must be filled by a Borough resident? At least that would give a job to a local person.

To Assembly members:

I support Ordinance 2012-07 to appoint members to service area boards. I was surprised by the opposition expressed at Tuesday's assembly meeting. I thought it was a no-brainer, so I didn't submit a comment earlier.

Board members provide an important public service and do so whether appointed or elected. I doubt that cronyism would play any part in appointing service area board members. We have a good history of appointed board activity. I agree that it is easier for people new to politics to apply for a position than to run for election. And service area boards are a good place to get started in public service. I have served on a service area board and found no difference in quality between those members who were elected and those who were appointed.

I appreciate Ms. Murphy's amendment for the mayor to seek board input on applicants, without obligation. This provides an opportunity for important local knowledge.

Voters don't have much information to rely on when choosing service area board members because candidate statements are not included in the election brochure. However it is not often an issue because there is rarely a contest for a seat. In fact, it is often hard to keep service area boards full. When no one runs for a seat or a member resigns, the mayor must appoint someone.

I support reducing the number of ballots required for an election, not so much for any cost-savings, but for clarity and an easier voting process.

This issue is not of sufficient significance to require a vote of the people. This is a matter well within the purview of assembly action. The selection process should be consistent across all the service areas. The boards' purposes and functions are the same, so there is no reason to seat the members differently.

Re: Ord. 2012-07 Service Area Boards from Elected to Appointed

Learning moments. There are many when serving on the Assembly. But, I think the vocal public reaction to the above ordinance is unfortunate. Yes, anyone who is willing to step up and serve on the Borough Assembly, had better have a thick skin, because there will be those who insult you, and attack you. It is called, being in the line of fire.

I do support this ordinance. Over the 9 years I served on the Assembly, I saw year after year, the struggle to find folks willing to run for service area boards. Throughout the borough, there were always positions open, to be filled, by appointment, after the election. And the cost in time and materials to the Borough Clerk, aka taxpayers, in gathering election information and printing it is huge. Voter pamphlets that must go to all in the general population, regardless that only 20% vote, are much larger than they would be, because of the Service Area Seats up for election. It had been my intent to bring this issue forward some years ago because of that cost, however I simply ran out of time. So, I welcomed this ordinance.

Sometimes we tend to overlook history. Back in the 1980's, when the 4 Roads Service Areas were formed in the borough, those roads boards consisted of elected positions. In 1991, 3 of the 4 Elected Service Area boards, asked the Borough to form one unified Road service area, for efficiency. Ordinance 1991-18, passed by the Assembly in August of 1991, did exactly that, and also went from elected Boards, to one board, all members appointed by the Mayor, those appointments confirmed by the Assembly. Alaska Statute 29.35.450 allows for the "establishment, operation, alteration or abolition of service area boards, by the Assembly", which is what was cited in the Ordinance. That Alaska Statute also gives the Assembly the authority now to act, if that is in the best interest of the public. Considering the public's often voiced concern about Borough expenses, you would think it would make sense.

The Planning Commission has always been appointed, again by the Mayor, with confirmation by the elected Assembly.

I have not always agreed with the decisions of the various mayors, regarding appointments to the Roads Board and the Planning Commission. And in reality, when the mayor decided to make some changes, I was concerned, but have found the appointments recommended and confirmed by the Assembly to be effective. Remember, the elected Assembly, has the final decision. Service area boards are advisory to the Assembly in all matters. They may be elected, but it is the Assembly with the final word.

With the amendment that Ms. Murphy proposed, the sitting Service Area Board would also be given the choice of weighing in on recommendations to the Mayor, for consideration. I believe that gives them more say of who serves, than they have under the current process.

In closing I sincerely apologize to Ms. Murphy for not being there to voice this opinion sooner. And I am so sorry for that. She deserves a heck of a lot better than what she has gotten. I commend her for bringing this forward.

Ordinance 2012-07 would represent a giant step backward for the residents of the Kenai Peninsula Borough.


