**KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH  
ORDINANCE 2012-15**

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE GRANT OF ASSETS FROM THE LOWELL  
POINT EMERGENCY SERVICE AREA TO THE LOWELL POINT VOLUNTEER  
FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**WHEREAS,** in the October 4, 2011, regular election the voters of the Lowell Point Emergency Service Area (Service Area) approved a proposition calling for the abolishment of the service area effective July 1, 2012; and

**WHEREAS,** the Service Area at its April 17, 2012, board meeting requested that remaining assets of the service area be transferred to the Lowell Point Volunteer Fire Department (LPVFD); and

**WHEREAS,** the LPVFD has requested the transfer of all remaining service area assets; and

**WHEREAS,** it is in the best interest of Lowell Point residents that service area fire fighting assets that were accumulated using taxpayer dollars and grants remain in the area for the purpose of the continued provision of firefighting, rescue and response services; and

**WHEREAS,** the LPVFD has been registered with the State and intends to continue providing fire fighting, rescue and response services in the Lowell Point area; and

**WHEREAS,** the borough has authority to transfer Service Area assets subject to the requirement that they be used for a public purpose that is within the power of the borough to provide; and

**WHEREAS,** a public purpose would be served by the continuation of fire response and emergency services in the Lowell Point area and the borough has fire fighting response and associated rescue powers in Lowell Point until July 1, 2012;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:**

**SECTION 1.** The mayor is authorized to enter into a grant agreement with the Lowell Point Volunteer Fire Department (LPVFD) to convey the remaining assets, except as specifically described below, of the Lowell Point Emergency Service Area to the LPVFD provided that the LPVFD remain a registered fire department with the

state, the assets are used for the public purposes of fire prevention, response and rescue, and LPVFD comply with borough grant requirements.

**SECTION 2.** The estimated value of the assets to be transferred is approximately \$36,481 and generally include without limitation the following:

Asset	Estimated Value
1 – heavy industrial generator	\$4,023
1 – air exchanger	\$7,486
Miscellaneous supplies, tools and equipment	\$24,972

**SECTION 3.** That the grant specifically shall not include the transfer of the following radio equipment as required by Federal Register OMB A-102 and any other assets found in possession of Lowell Point Emergency Service Area that the borough is prohibited by law or grant agreement from transferring to the LPVFD:
