RESOLUTION NO. 69-7 R

NOTICE OF ELECTION

A RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO PLACE BEFORE THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH THE PROPOSITION OF WHETHER BONDS FOR SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION SHOULD BE ISSUED.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

1. A special election is hereby called to be held July 8, 1969, for the purpose of placing before the qualified voters of the Kenai Peninsula Borough the following proposition:

Shall the Kenai Peninsula Borough incur indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 for the purpose of acquiring and preparing sites, constructing new school buildings, adding to and renovating existing buildings and acquiring facilities therefor and issue its general obligation bonds therefor at such times and for such amounts as the assembly may determine?

- 2. Precincts and precinct polling places are as specified by the Secretary of State and as indicated on the list attached herewith.
- 3. The polls will be open from 8 o'clock a.m. until 8:00 p.m.
- 4. Any person is qualified to vote who:

Is a citizen of the United States, is at least 19 years of age, has been a resident of the Kenai Peninsula Borough for at least 30 days immediately preceding the election, is able to speak or read the English language unless prevented by physical disability or who voted in the general election of November 4, 1924, and who owns real property within the borough listed on the latest tax assessment roll.

- 5. a. A qualified voter may vote absentee (1) if he believes he will be unavoidably absent from the borough on election day or (2) he will be unable to be present at the polls because of physical disability or (3) if he believes he will be unable to be present at the polls because of physical inaccessibility of the polls causing undue travel expense, hardship or hazard to the voter.
- b. A qualified voter may apply for an absentee ballot in person or by mail to the assembly clerk at the borough office or to any magistrate in the borough, or may apply through a personal representative providing such representative has a written authorization to secure an absentee ballot signed by the voter applying. The application must state he is a qualified voter of the borough, give the physical location of his residence and his mailing address and the reason he qualified for an absentee ballot. Requests for absentee ballots will be received until 5 o'clock p.m. on the day prior to the election.
- c. Absentee ballots voted in accordance with instructions issued to absentee ballot applicants will be received by any magistrate in the borough by hand delivery until 5 p.m. on the third day following the election, provided that the absentee ballot outer envelope is postmarked not later than the day of the election.
