NOTICE OF ELECTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

1. A special election is hereby called to be held October 7, 1969, for the purpose of placing before the qualified voters of the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area the following proposition:

PROPOSITION: Shall the Kenai Peninsula Borough incur indebtedness in a sum not exceeding \$350,000 plus accrued interest for hospital purposes in the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area, including but not limited to site acquisition, purchase, construction, reconstruction of, and the purchase of capital equipment for, a hospital to provide hospital services in the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area as the Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough may deem necessary and to pledge to the payment of any indebtedness so incurred the assets acquired with the proceeds of such indebtedness together with such sums as are necessary raised from ad valorem taxes within the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area and annually appropriated by the Assembly for the purpose of assuming and retiring the existing indebtedness of the Central Peninsula Development Corporation to the Small Business Administration of the United States secured by said assets?

- 4. Any person is qualified to vote who:

Is a citizen of the United States, is at least 19 years of age, has been a resident of the Central Peninsula Hospital Service Area for at least 30 days immediately preceding the election, is able to speak or read the English language unless prevented by physical disability or who voted in the general election of November 4, 1924.

- 5. a. A qualified voter may vote absentee (1) if he believes he will be unavoidably absent from the borough on election day or (2) he will be unable to be present at the polls because of physical disability or (3) if he believes he will be unable to be present at the polls because of physical inaccessibility of the polls causing undue travel expense, hardship or hazard to the voter.
- b. A qualified voter may apply for an absentee ballot in person or by mail to the borough clerk at the borough office or to any magistrate in the service area, or may apply through a personal representative providing such representative has a written authorization to secure an absentee ballot signed by the voter applying. The application must state he is a qualified voter of the borough, give the physical location of his residence and his mailing address and the reason he qualified for an absentee ballot. Requests for absentee ballots will be received until 5 o'clock on the day prior to the election.
- c. Absentee ballots voted in accordance with instructions issued to absentee ballot applicants will be received by any magistrate in the service area by hand delivery until 5 p.m. on the third day following the election, provided that the absentee ballot outer envelope is postmarked not later than the day of the election.
