NOW THEREFORE, THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH DECLARES:

Section 1. That in Assembly District 2, Seat B, no candidate received the required 40 percent vote and a Runoff Election will be held with Stan (Sam) McLane and Tommy Corr the only candidates for that seat.

Section 2. That in Assembly District 3, Seat E, Betty Glick was reelected to a three year term.

- Section 3. That in Assembly District 4, Seat B, Brentley Keene was reelected to a three year term. In Seat C, Tom Brown was elected to a three year term.
- Section 4. That in the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area, Pat Shields was elected to a lne year term, Seat B, Larry DeBroeck was elected to a three year term, Seat C, and Rebecca Symens was elected to a three year term, Seat D.
- Section 5. That in the Bear Creek Fire Service Area there were no candidates for Seats C and D, but Eric Traber was elected to a three year term in Seat C and Clara Fultz was elected to Seat D, a three year term by write-in vote.
- Section 6. That in the Central Peninsula Emergency Medical Service Area, Clay Shulte was elected to a two year term in Seat B and Mildred FitzGerald was elected to a one year term in Seat C. There were no candidates for Seat E, but Robert Fenimore was elected to a three year term by write-in vote.
- Section 7. That in the Central Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Ray Posey was elected to Seat A, a two year term, and John Cook was elected to a three year term in Seat E.
- Section 8. That in the East Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Daniel Greer was elected to a three year term in Seat E.
- Section 9. That in for the new Kalifornsky Fire Service Area the following board was elected: Seat A, a three year term, Frank Kraxberger; Seat B, a three year term, Emery Thibodeau; Seat C, a two year term, Betsy Arbelovsky; Seat D, a two year term, Steve F. Townsend; and Seat E, a one year term, Steve Wiese.
- Section 10. That in the Nikiski Fire Service Area Michael Blackmon was elected to Seat D, a three year term and Scott Hagen was elected to Seat E, a three year term.
- Section 11. That in the North Peninsula Recreation Service Area  $\overline{\text{Audrey Hodgins}}$  was elected to Seat C, a three year term. In Seat D, Linda Myers was elected to a three year term.
- Section 12. That in the North Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Jody Cason was elected to a three year term.
- Section 13. That in the Ridgeway Fire Service Area there was no candidate for Seat C, but Boyd Miller was elected to a three year term and Jack Lounsbury was elected to a three year term in Seat D.
- Section 14. That for the new Ridgeway/Sterling Fire Service Area the following board was elected: Seat A, a one year term, David Wynkoop; Seat B, a one year term, Randy Nicklas; Seat C, a two year term, Glenn Schrader; Seat D, a three year term, Ken Chumley; and Seat E, a three year term, Jack Lounsbury.

- Section 15. That in the South Peninsula Hospital Service Area Gene Williams was elected to a three year term, Seat A; Marguerite Lambert was elected to a three year term, Seat B; and John Cooper was elected to a three year term, Seat C.
- Section 16. That in the South Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Henrietta Ledger was elected to a two year term in Seat A, Wayne Hanson was elected to a one year term in Seat C and Marie Walli was elected to a three year term in Seat E.
- $\underline{\text{Section 17}}.$  That Propositions 1 through 8 and Proposition 10 were approved by the majority of voters in the Kenai Peninsula Borough.
- Section 18. That Proposition 11 and 11(a) and 11(b) were approved by the voters of a portion of the Ridgeway Precinct and the Sterling Precinct, ratifying Ord. 85-37 for the establishment of the Ridgeway/Ster-ling Fire Service Area.
- Section 19. That Proposition 12 and 12(a) and 12b) were approved by the voters of the Kalifonsky Precinct and a portion of the Tustumena Precinct, ratifying Ord. 84-43 for establishment of the Kalifonsky Fire Service Area.
- Section 20. That Propositions 13 through 16, including (a) and (b) portions were approved by the voters of the Central, East, North and South Road Maintenance Service Areas respectively, ratifying Resolution 85-140 for acquisition of road improvement powers within the Borough Road Maintenance Service Areas.
