NOW THEREFORE, THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH DECLARES:

Section 1. That in the boroughwide election for two Board of Education members, Betty L. Obendorf and Michael J. Tauriainen were elected having received the highest vote tallies and in excess of the required 40 percent of the vote.

Section 2. That in the boroughwide election, Proposition 1 approving issuance of up to \$4,662,000 in bonds for waste facilities was approved by the voters.

Section 3. That in Assembly District 1, Jonathan W. Sewall was elected to another three year term in Seat B.

Section 4. That in Assembly District 2, John C. Davis and Thomas A. Atkinson received the most votes for Seat C, but neither received 40 percent of the vote and there will be a Runoff Election as a result, on October 24.

Section 5. That in Assembly District 2, Seat D, the tally was sufficiently close that Mr. Evans requested a recount. On October 10, 1989 at 10:30 a.m. with Mr. Evans as witness, the District 2 ballots were again counted with a slightly different tally, but the same result. Patrick M. O'Connell was elected for a three year term.

Section 6. That in Assembly District 3, Seat A, Gary Superman received the highest number of votes and was elected to a three year term.

Section 7. That in Assembly District 3, Seat D, Phil N. Nash was elected to another three year term.

- Section 8. That in Assembly District 4, Seat D, Marie E. Walli was elected to another three year term.
- Service Area Joe L. Aprill was elected to another 3 year term in Seat A and Clifford Shafer was elected to another three year term in Seat B. The boundaries of the service area will be expanded through the approval of Proposition 4.
- Section 10. That in the Bear Creek Fire Service Area, Edward Zimmerman was elected to another three year term in Seat A and George Zimmerman was elected to another three year term in Seat B.
- Service Area, Donald G. Baxter was elected to a three year term in Seat C. Darlene Wilder, the candidate for Seat D, received the most votes and is elected to the seat.
- Section 12. That in the Kalifornsky Fire Service Area, James A. McKinney was elected to a one year term in Seat C and Barbara S. Olson was elected to a three year term in Seat E.
- Section 13. That in the Nikiski Fire Service Area, Mae Leighton was elected to a three year term in Seat A and Patrick "Jack" Focose was elected to a three year term in Seat B. There being no candidate for Seat C, Kurt Morris, receiving the most write-in votes was elected to a three year term.
- Section 14. That in the North Peninsula Recreation Service Area, Ty Miller was elected to another three year term in Seat A, Linda Myers was elected to another three year term in Seat B, and Annette O'Connell was elected to a one year term in Seat E.
- Section 15. That in the Ridgeway Fire Service Area, Harold O. Lockwood was elected to a three year term in Seat A and Grace E. Merkes was elected to a three year term in Seat B.
- Section 16. That in the South Peninsula Hospital Service Area, Elizabeth Fritz was elected to another three year term in Seat H. There being no candidates for remaining seats, Mary McAnnelly was elected to Seat D, a one year term, by write-in vote, Tom Schoder was elected to Seat G, a three year term, and Frances Brymer was elected to Seat I, a three year term, by write-in vote.
- Service Area the results are inconclusive due to an inadequate number of ballots being given to voters in Tustumena Precinct. Therefore, at the Runoff Election of October 24, ballots will again be voted for this service area in Tustumena Precinct and the results will be added to those received from other precincts at this election.

Kenai Peninsula Borough Res. 89-110 Page 5 Section 18. That in the East Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Mary McDonald was elected to a one year term in Seat B, Richard A. Jones was elected to a three year term in Seat C, and Cindy L. Miller was elected to a three year term in Seat D.

Section 19. That in the North Peninsula Road Maintenance Service Area Sharon Brower was elected to a three year term in Seat C and Percy Johnson was elected to a three year term in Seat D.

Service Area, Marvin Butze was elected to a one year term in Seat A, Bernard von Keitz was elected to a three year term in Seat C, Darlene Crawford was elected to a three year term in Seat D and Fred Christiansen was elected to a two year term in Seat E by write-in vote.

Section 21. That in a non-areawide vote, Proposition 2, to remove restrictions on on the borough's non-areawide port and harbor powers, failed approval by the voters outside city.

Section 22. That in a non-areawide vote, Proposition 3, an advisory vote concerning establishing zoning outside cities, failed approval by the voters outside city.
