## A RESOLUTION OPPOSING COMBINING THE ELECTION PRECINCTS OF COOPER LANDING AND MOOSE PASS BY THE DIVISION OF ELECTIONS

- WHEREAS, the reapportionment of the State of Alaska has caused new boundaries for Senate and House districts, in turn causing new precinct boundaries; and
- WHEREAS, the new boundaries for precincts within House District 8 have been proposed with the old Cooper Landing and Moose Pass precincts being combined into one; and
- WHEREAS, historically the communities of Cooper Landing and Moose Pass have had their own election precincts; and
- WHEREAS, the voters residing in these two communities would be required to drive 30 miles or more in, oftentimes, treacherous winter conditions in order to cast their vote; and
- WHEREAS, the elimination of one of these precincts would only result in a financial savings to the state of approximately \$300 to 500 per election;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- Section 1. That the Division of Elections is encouraged to maintain Cooper Landing and Moose Pass as designated election precincts.
- Section 2. That copies of this resolution shall be sent to Lt. Governor Jack Coghill, Representatives Gene Kubina, Gail Phillips, and Mike Navarre, and Senators Jay Kerttula, Curt Menard and Paul Fisher and Division of Elections Director Charlot Thickstun.
- Section 3. That this resolution takes effect immediately.
