**KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH
RESOLUTION 93-26**

**A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING A REQUEST FOR CAPITAL FUNDING FOR THE
VILLAGE OF TYONEK, ALASKA**

WHEREAS, the Native Village of Tyonek Council represents the unincorporated community of Tyonek, located within the boundaries of the Kenai Peninsula Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to provide adequate water facilities for the residents of Tyonek, Alaska, and has determined the community water system to be the number one priority for the community; and

WHEREAS, \$300,000 is needed for completion of Phase III of the Village Safe Water Project and to upgrade the water treatment plant; and

WHEREAS, the Native Village of Tyonek Council will take control of the Tyonek Airstrip on June 30, 1993, and is in need of a D-8K tractor dozer; and

WHEREAS, Tyonek does not have any storage of bulk fuel and would like to have \$55,000 for bulk fuel storage; and

WHEREAS, Village owned buildings are heated by electricity which costs approximately \$3000 per month, and a savings would be realized if the buildings were switched to diesel; and

WHEREAS, the funding requested by the Village would provide much needed jobs for the residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

SECTION 1. That the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly hereby supports Tyonek's request for funding as follows:


Village Safe Water Project	\$300,000
Cat D-8K Tractor-Dozer w/attachments	\$145,000
Bulk Fuel Storage	\$ 55,000
Upgrade Heating System	\$ 30,000

SECTION 2. That these projects be included in the KPB's 1993 Legislative Priority List under unincorporated communities.

SECTION 3. That copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Walter J. Hickel, Senators Suzanne Little, Judith Salo, Georgianna Lincoln, Fred Zharoff, and Jay Kerttula, and Representatives Mike Navarre, Gail Phillips, Gary Davis, Irene Nicholia, Cliff Davidson and Curt Menard.

SECTION 4. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
