**WHEREAS**, an error was made in the requirements and duties for the firefighter/EMT II-D job description and a correction is required;


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:**

**Position Description:** Firefighter I/EMT II-D

**Service Type:** Classified - Range N (56-hour)

**Definition:** Under the general direction and supervision of the CES chief or his designee, the Firefighter I/EMT II-D performs emergency procedures in order to preserve and maintain life and property.

**Minimum Qualifications:** High school diploma or GED; at least 21 years of age; currently certified as an Emergency Medical Technician II/Auto-defibrillation (EMT II-D) and Firefighter I by the State of Alaska; and possess a valid, unrestricted Alaska driver's license. Shall obtain EMT III/ACLS certification from the State of Alaska and the American Heart Association and certification as a medivac provider within eighteen months. Part-time experience as a volunteer with Central Emergency Services preferred.

**Responsibilities:**

1. Performs firefighting duties according to standard operating procedures.
2. Performs EMT II-D skills as defined by the State of Alaska and departmental standard operating procedures.
3. Responds to fire alarms and other emergency calls.
4. Performs assigned duties in maintaining apparatus, buildings, equipment, grounds and hydrants as directed by supervisor.
5. Participates in drill demonstrations and courses in hydraulics, pump operation and maintenance, firefighting techniques and medical skills.
6. Has a working knowledge of the proper use of fire department emergency tools and equipment.
7. Participates and assists in training programs for department staff.
8. Other related duties as assigned.

**Examination:** A physical examination is required.
