## KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH RESOLUTION 94-100

## A RESOLUTION URGING THE NORTH PACIFIC FISHERIES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL TO ALLOCATE THE TOTAL ALLOWABLE CATCH (TAC) OF PACIFIC COD TO A TRIMESTER OR QUARTERLY SEASON

- WHEREAS, the commercial fishing season for pacific cod has been starting on January 1st and closing when the total allowable catch (TAC) has been reached; and
- WHEREAS, due to increased effort the fishery has closed in early spring preventing the development of other markets throughout the year on the Kenai Peninsula; and
- WHEREAS, the economic health of the coastal communities on the Kenai Peninsula rely in large part on its commercial fishing industry; and
- WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Kenai Peninsula Borough to promote sustainable fisheries throughout the year; and
- WHEREAS, year round availability of seafood helps create and promote value added products; and
- WHEREAS, extending the fishing season throughout the year creates more year-round employment;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- SECTION 1. That the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly urges the North Pacific Fisheries Management Council to allocate the Total Allowable Catch for Pacific Cod in the Gulf of Alaska on a quarterly or trimester basis whichever best accomplishes a yearround management scheme.
- SECTION 2. That a copy of this resolution shall be sent to all members of the North Pacific Fisheries Management Council.
- SECTION 3. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
