Persons serving "on-call" who are not regular borough employees as either a firefighter or emergency medical services provider shall be eligible for consideration as an active volunteer if all other criteria are satisfied."

Assembly Members Martin, Long and Moss spoke in favor of Ordinance 2002-38.
